

## Coventry Hills Building Safer Communities scores 2 big wins

Are you a member of one of the NHCA Building Safer Communities Facebook groups? You might know it better for your particular community as the Coventry Hills Watchdogs, Panorama Hills NHCA BSC Blockwatch. Harvest Hills NHCA BSC Blockwatch, or the Country Hills NHCA BSC Blockwatch. If so, you are likely in a subgroup that is particular for your neighbourhood as determined by maps in those Facebook groups.

The administration committee, spearheaded by community volunteers, started this initiative in Coventry Hills out of frustration over crime in the community, just over

2 years ago. They had no experience with block watch or crime prevention but built the program into a reputable crime fighting entity now supported by the Calgary Police Service and with a number of other communities reaching out for assistance to set up something similar. To date, Coventry Hills has over 1400 members while the other communities are fairly new and still growing in numbers. The CPS has members in each community group and respond if required.

How successful has the initiative been? The Captains of each area meet regularly with the NHCA CPS representative to discuss crime trends, strategies, and share information that has built a strong relationship between the community and CPS, mostly dealing with crime, but also other policing matters including traffic and domestic violence. It took a long time to convince people to call the police if observing suspicious activity and they continue to remind people to call if something doesn't seem right. Why?

The Building Safer Communities group has been responsible for the apprehension of individuals with a cache of weapons in a stolen car from Red Deer, shutting down a drug house, but most recently, capturing the infamous Porch Pirate in December and a prowler in January. All because someone called the police with something that didn't seem right. The stolen car, was a simple noise in a back alley that someone called in because of the Facebook group.

The Porch Pirate made national news at Christmas. He approached front doors shortly after parcels were left on doorsteps, sweeping them away quickly, with one particular identifying doorbell video broadcast across the internet. A Coventry resident that had viewed that video on the Watchdogs group observed the individual on her street about a week later and called CPS. They quickly swooped in and apprehended and charged the individual.

On January 3rd at 250am, a Coventry resident reported a car prowler. CPS responded and suspect was apprehended and has a long history with police.



Our Community Resource Officer constantly reminds us that if you see something 'not right', to call it in and let them decide if it is worth response. We continue to see people posting suspicious activity in these Facebook groups and some question it as a waste of resources. We encourage you to follow that request and call CPS if something doesn't look right and let them decide if it is worth checking out. Above all, please do not put yourself in a dangerous position if you notice something.

put into their bags. Many of the children have said that they will continue this act of giving back by cleaning up around their own neighbourhoods.











### Honourable Michelle Rempel, M.P. Calgary Nose Hill

In December, I introduced a private members bill to define "bestiality" in the Criminal Code.

This bill responds to the 2016 R. v. D.L.W. Supreme Court ruling that upheld the acquittal of a British Columbia man who was charged with bestiality after compelling the family dog to sexually abuse his

16-year-old stepdaughter. Lawyers for the man argued that the 1954 bestiality law only included penetration of an animal. The Supreme Court justices agreed, saying it would be inappropriate for courts to expand that definition beyond what was intended by the politicians who

criminal code.

I believe this to be a non-partisan issue that is clearly needed to keep both humans and animals safe. The current law is reflective of an archaic understanding of sex, and the change that I am seeking to make with my bill both reflects the language of the Supreme Court ruling, and frankly is a no-brainer. I would appreciate hearing your

Following the successful launch of the Northern Hills Night Market in 2017 by Ian McAnerin, Northern Hills Connect (NHC) is already seeing results to their new Initiative '1 Year, 1 Business', launched in January. '1 Year, 1 Business' is the focus for NHC on 2018 - bringing one Northern hills based social enterprise business to launch in 2018, and working towards the overall goal of 5 social enterprises over the next 5 years.

The group met in January to award September pitch competition participants their prize money, and progress reports shared at that event indicated that several of the entrepreneurs involved with the group are moving forward with their business ideas.

One of those entrepreneurs is Stephanie Paull, a graphic designer residing in the community, and a hopeful candidate to launch a socially driven enterprise in the next year. "The group is filled with truly amazing and inspiring people who offered the support I needed to lift off. I'm really grateful to be a part of it all," said Stephanie, who helped brand the Northern Hills Night Market, and designed the NHC logos.

At the NHC Pitch Competition in fall 2017, Stephanie pitched her idea Kindlii: a platform connecting neighbors in an online marketplace which utilizes the auctioning system. "Buying and selling locally can be a fun thing! It should be community driven. I am designing a system that is simple, very efficient and truly different from what all the other platforms have to offer."

Since the pith competition, NHC has helped connect Stephanie with the resources to progress. "I was referred to attend a feasibility study at Momentum where I then applied for and was accepted into the Self Employment Program. The course will help me build a solid Business Plan which I intend to launch with this year."

Support from community partners has been key in moving the initiatives






