Low AGM Attendance Suggests Community's Apathy

Northern Hills Community Association represents the largest number of residents in Calgary, with a population of 58,000 people and still growing! Year after year we are finding the need to advocate more, and engage more residents in various initiatives, programs, services, and events. This year alone we had multiple great projects and successful outcomes, but there is still lots of work ahead and many things that require residents support and involvement! Our community continues to suffer an infrastructure and program deficit largely due to apathy when only 45 people out of 58,000 attend our AGM. So we want to know, what will it take to ENGAGE this community? What will it take to get people to take a stand for a high school, off-leash parks, a medical centre, ice rinks, baby clinic, LRT, playgrounds, meeting space, or whatever forces you into your car every day?

Odds are pretty good you were not at the NHCA Annual General Meeting on April 12th. With 58000 people in our community and loads of sponsored food, we had 45 residents join us, and many more at the open house prior to that. We would like to thank Servus Credit Union, specifically their newly opened high-tech branch in Panorama Hills, Good Earth in Coventry Hills, and Famoso Neopolitan Pizzeria on Country Hills Blvd NE for providing delicious food and drinks for the AGM.

Councillor Jyoti Gondek hosted the Open House which included information tables on Ward 3 activities and initiatives such as Vivo, Advocates for North Calgary High School, SoccerTech, Brookfield Developments, Blockwatch and more. Unfortunately, less than 100 people attended even though we had a rare visit by Calgary Police Chief Roger Chaffin.

The very brief AGM followed, where we elected our new board and recognized Community Heroes including Brian Wells (Building Safer Communities) and Luz Bolo (Northern Hills News Editor). We also recognized some Community Heroes that work in the community but have gone above and beyond to assist the NHCA. Those awards went to Lynne Banning, who provided outstanding contributions to us through her role the past 9 years in the Ward 3 office; and both Cynthia Watson and Nicole Dawe



Community Association Notes



From the **President**

I want to update you on some achievements we reached over the last year and what the upcoming year will bring.

It has been a financially challenging year as economics have had some direct impact on our primary sources of revenue which is advertising and sport program enrollment. Like most non-for-profit organizations, we have had to get pretty creative as a board in finding solutions to adhere us to the budget without compromising the programming and support the community has demanded. A big part of this success comes from the amazing work our operational staff does. A huge thank you to them for keeping us compliant and being the direct connection to the community, our volunteers, and our many partners. I would also like to thank the many businesses that support us in so many ways from advertising and sponsorship, to gifts/swag for events and providing food/ drinks and manpower whenever we ask.

Last year, we honored several guys from the Block Watch group who were ramping up this program in the Coventry area which has expanded into the Panorama community. In fact, other sister communities such as Hidden Valley and Bridgeland are working with our Block watch group to duplicate their model. It has been successful in reducing criminal activity and resulted in arrests due to their great relationship with our police partners. We would

love to expand this program into Country Hills Village and Harvest Hills but need representatives from those communities to assist with driving the initiative. Let us know if you want to

get involved with this volunteer watchdog group.

What started as an idea a couple years ago will bear fruit this year as the Harvest Hills Hub. All the funding required for the redevelopment of the park and outdoor meeting space has been raised- a total of \$285,000. This is a result of many fundraising efforts and grant applications. We are planning to break ground once spring comes and will start to plan for a grand opening and many other outdoor events at this location. Thanks to the dedicated committee driving this legacy project.

Doing a single park takes a lot of effort and money so when it was determined that Coventry had many parks at varying stages of disarray, a long-term plan for that entire community called Creating Coventry, began to evolve between NHCA, Vivo and our city partners. A great deal of time has been invested in community engagement to determine what Coventry residents want to see in those green spaces vs multiple parks that contain a slide, monkey bars, and a single bench. They are taking a holistic approach to community planning that will ensure that the parks serve all residents both young and old with staged re-development over many years.

The NHCA continues to play an active role in reviewing new developments for

the Northern Hills and we have been involved in many conversations with developers over the last year. One positive result of this approach has meant ensuring a commercial development next to Superstore, in the parking lot, didn't infringe on pedestrian traffic that flows from Coventry to the commercial area and that pedestrian experience is considered with appropriate lighting, greenery,

seating, and eye appeal. We will continue to work toward being more strategic with our community planning and advocacy.

In our Coventry Garden, we have partnered with the Northern Hills Cultural Association and have received a grant to expand and retrofit our gardens to make it easier for seniors to utilize. Items such as raised beds (to reduce bending) and access

for those with limited mobility are all being considered. It will also be another avenue where we are looking to have programming around gardening/composting, harvesting, and food/health classes.

Last year we began a strategic partnership with Soccer Tech so that we can begin to deliver added-value to our community programs with

What is SCAN?

A message from the Federation of **Calgary Communities**

The Safer Communities and Neighbourhoods Act (SCAN) is a civil legislation that investigates residential and commercial properties that residents identify as issues in their community. Once a resident reports to SCAN, investigators will begin a process to access and determine the issue with that property.

SCAN targets properties, not people. If criminal activity is uncovered by the unit, CPS and SCAN investigators will work together to resolve the issue. SCAN investigators investigate drug and sex trafficking and/or gang-related crime.

Low AGM Attendance Suggests Community's Apathy

(and the entire Vivo team), for building a supportive and strong relationship with the community and the NHCA. We would also like to recognize Tracy Martin, Alanna Bryant, Simon Ng, and Susan Taylor as fantastic members of the Vivo team.

Advocacy was a focus of the evening. I asked, "Out of curiosity, how many people are in one of the community Facebook groups?" to which a number of people raised their hands. We have become conditioned in North Central Calgary, that everything is close. By car. We have been conditioned that when someone asks in one of those groups where the nearest Korean BBQ, or kids playcentre, or 24 hour medical centre, or recreation centre other than Vivo is located, an answer of Airdrie, Sunridge, downtown, or even further south are acceptable answers. Former politicians, a lack of engagement in our community

and simply "getting used to it" have created this conditioning. We have accepted a lack of infrastructure as the norm while the newer communities elsewhere have flourished largely in part to loud political voices. But in the last year or so, the NHCA has changed direction as an organization.

We have started getting political, not partisan, just political. We pushed hard in the last Provincial election that candidates should be local, not drop ins, and we will continue to do that this election. ASK THAT QUESTION OF CANDIDATES. WHERE DO YOU LIVE? Our past 2 MP's for Calgary Northeast (Coventry Hills and Harvest Hills) have been ineffective, partially because they didn't live here. We need to change that. The last civic election, we had 4 local candidates running for Councillor instead of candidates that did not live in the ward. Effective the next provincial election, Calgary - Northern Hills will be split into Calgary - Northeast, Calgary - Beddington and Calgary - North as we mentioned in previous newsletters. We need LOCAL candidates.

We have 2 more elections on our doorstep in the next 18 months and we need to engage this community to speak out about the issues. We need you to ask why North Central Calgary has to drive far for a public high school? Why we have to drive far for after hours medical care? Why we are driving to other recreation centres because our own doesn't meet our needs? Why the city has a requirement of 1 ice rink per 18500 people but that standard doesn't apply to the 120000 people with only 2 rinks? Why a community of 58000 people does not have a single off-leash park? Why is North Central Calgary constantly passed over for the needs of Southeast







Calgary? We are preparing a speaking points sheet for every home so that when a candidate comes to your door, you can ask not just if they are aware, but HOW they will change it. We encourage you to ask, do you live here? Do you play here? Do you eat here?

But we are not doing this alone. We are reaching out to neighbouring North Central Calgary communities like Evanston, Hidden Valley, Sage Hill, Kincora, Beddington, Carrington and more. We are working with our elected officials and advocating to make things happen here. To be heard. We are pushing politicians to know the issues. YOUR

Advocacy is free. We will advocate for you whether you are a member of not. But we are limited on what we can do because membership fees help cover the costs of advo-

cacy. Membership also shows politicians and bureaucrats that we are engaged. Look around you and see the great











things happening in the area as a result of volunteers and membership. Imagine how much more we could do with YOU. We cannot do it without members. We cannot do it without volunteers. Talk to you neighbours. Talk to you friends. Talk to the Parents Councils at schools. Or parents at the ice rink. Spread the word. This is OUR community and IT'S OUR TURN.

an addition of technical training and the intent to create consistency to both the enrollment and experience year after year. We are looking at the possibility of adding other sports programs that may be currently unfulfilled in this community but the challenge to get new initiatives off the ground is volunteer manpower.

About a year ago, one initiative landed on our doorstep from Philip Lozano as extension of the Momentum Program. He helped to start up a grass roots organization, known as Northern Hills Connect, whose purpose is to help fledgling social enterprises to get off the ground. This initiative helps to foster and support community-based businesses that are not just about profit but also serves the greater good of the community through helping marginalized citizens get employment, develop community inclusion or improves the environment. The group has received some grant funding, held a pitch competition, and has held workshops. One cool outcome that has evolved out of this group is a night market that will be held at Vivo this summer.

No one will be able to say that creativity isn't alive in the Northern Hills. Thanks to the driving force of Kim Walker and board member Laura Hack we are well underway in getting a Mural developed along the fence line of Coventry Hills Blvd and Country Hills Way. This will likely be a world record event that will put our community on the map. This dowdy fence will get a fresh face and will be a destination art exhibit. Stay tuned for details as we will need many volunteers throughout the summer.

Other great news: we have seen participation growth in our senior group SPRY and they have some exciting stuff on the horizon. Our At Home in the Hills program has sprouted new legs and is planning on creating some social events to bring together existing residents as well as helping new members of our community/country become connected. Our Rink volunteers are looking for ways to improve our winter skating experience plus we are looking for new rink for the Country Hills area. An Arts and Crafts committee is in its initial planning phase to make classes accessible and this year we hosted our first Break a Lego family event for Lego lovers to compete and have fun.

Advocacy continues to be a huge part of what we do because our community cannot afford apathy. I love where we live but after this year I can truly admit that our community needs are often overlooked.

We are reshaping our voice and influence at all levels of government so that we are that constant squeaky wheel that refuses to go away. We have tried polite and we have tried being brash, both without much suc-



CONDO TERMINOLOGY Get in on the lingo of condos

∩ •I'm a newbie condo ■buyer, and I'm a little mystified by the industry jargon. Any chance you can help me straighten it out?

A I'm constantly being pulled asside by owners or the general public about condominium ownership and what the different terms means. To help you out, here's a refresher on some of the lingo.

WHAT IS A CONDOMINIUM:

A condominium can be a townhome, conventional, commercial, bareland or any type of property with shared ownership, in which each owner owns the space within their walls, floors and ceiling of the unit to which they hold title, and jointly owns a portion of all the common property. Your home is still your castle, but there are different rules, obligations and financial responsibility that come with living and owning a condominium.

CONDOMINIUM CORPORA-TION:

Every condominium development has a condominium corporation that comes into existence when a condominium plan is registered with the Land Titles Office. The corporation is

made up of everyone who owns a unit in the development, and the condominium's board of director's runs it with the help of a good management company like New Concept Management

BOARD OF DIRECTORS:

In essence, the role of a board, as elected by its owners, is to act honestly and in good faith exercising the powers and in discharging their official duties. These include maintaining the common property and assets of the Condominium Corporation, as well as setting policies and enforcing its bylaws.

UNIT FACTORS:

The measure used to determine a condo owner's share of condominium contributions (fees) and voting rights. Typically, unit factor is proportional to the size of the owner's condominium unit The total sum of the unit factors for all the units on a condominium plan is 10,000. It is important to know the unit factor assigned to your unit because it will affect your condominium contributions and your voting rights.

BYLAWS:

Every condominium has a set of bylaws, which set out the rules and regulations that

govern the corporation. They are a legal binding obligation of the owners and occupants in a condominium corporation. In order for the bylaws to be enforceable they must be registered with Land Titles. The condominium board is responsible for enforcing the bylaws. The bylaws may cover such things as whether pets are allowed to live in the building, renovation guidelines, parking restrictions, and more.

RESERVE FUND STUDY:

A Reserve Fund Study is an important tool that should be utilized by the Board of Directors with the help of their Management Company, like New Concept Management Inc. to maintain and enhance the major common property assets of the Condominium Corporation. The Reserve Fund Study provides a multi-year funding plan for major capital expenditures. In Alberta, the Condominium **Property**

Act requires Condominium Corporations to complete a Reserve Fund Study every five

Move, Sleep, Sit

Excerpts from Dr. JE MacLean's original article for the First 2000 Days Network

In November 2017, the Canadian 24h Movement Guidelines for the Early Years (0-4 years) were released. According to the new guidelines, a healthy 24 hours for very young children includes:

For infants (under 1 year old):

- MOVE: Being physically active several times in a variety of ways, particularly through interactive floor-based play. For those not yet mobile, this includes at least 30 minutes of tummy time spread throughout the day while awake.
- **SLEEP:** 14-17 hours (for those aged 0-3 months) or 12-16

hours (for those aged 4-11 months) of good-quality sleep, including naps.

 SIT: Not being restrained for more than one hour at a time (e.g. in a high chair). When sedentary, engaging in pursuits such as reading and storytelling with a caregiver is encouraged. Screen time is not recommended.

For toddlers

(1-2 years old) and preschoolers (3-4 years old):

 MOVE: At least 180 minutes spent in a variety of physical activities at any intensity spread throughout the day, but more is better. Include energetic play for both age groups, with preschoolers getting at least 60 minutes of it.

- SLEEP: 11-14 hours of goodquality sleep for toddlers, and 10-13 for preschoolers, which may include naps, with consistent bedtimes and wake-up times.
- SIT: Not being restrained for more than one hour at a time (e.g. in a stroller) or sitting for extended periods. When sedentary, engaging in pursuits such as reading and storytelling with a caregiver is encouraged. Sedentary screen time for those younger than two years old is not recommended, and no more than one hour for those aged 2-4 years, but less is better.


