

June is a busy month on the Northern Hills Mural front with the scraping and power washing of the fence as well as the priming and base layers which need to be painted on to ensure the longevity of the Mural. We would love your help with this as well, and welcome individuals, groups and even local painting companies to come and help us out. Please reach out to us at mural@ northernhills.ab.ca if you can volunteer your time and labour. At this point, we are also looking for donations of gently used paint brushes, rollers or industrial sized pails, so if you have some cluttering up your

house or garage we would gladly take them off your hands. Donations of these items can be dropped off at the Northern Hills Office in the Genstar wing of Vivo. Thank you in advance for your generosity.

Our expected timeline is as follows: In July we will be finalizing the design with the artist and making sure all the paint and details are ready to go for August 4th-6th. We will be completing the mural in August and applying the top coats to the mural to preserve its longevity. September 15th weekend will be the big reveal and celebration where everyone will have a chance to walk along the mural and see the final product, as well as enjoy Calgary's food trucks and the company of our fellow neighbours.

Looking forward to seeing you this summer along the fence for some painting and celebrating the 25th anniversary of the Northern Hills Community Association.







# HEALTH CORNER

## Window & Balcony Safety

With the return of warmer weather, Emergency Medical Services (EMS) would like to remind parents and caregivers of an often overlooked hazard in the home - access to open windows. Every year, paramedics respond to emergencies where a child has fallen from an open window, often from the second floor. These can be avoided by following safety measures. Take the time to assess potential hazards in your home before a preventable fall occurs.

#### Windows and screens

- Prevent access to windows by moving furniture such as cribs, beds, stools, and change tables out from under them;
- Keep drapery cords out of childrens' reach. Wrap excess cord around cleats, or tie-downs to avoid a choking hazard;
- Remember, screens are not safety devices. They are designed to keep bugs out, not children in.

#### **Balconies**

- Do not underestimate a child's ability to climb. Furniture and other items stored on balconies and decks can be used to climb resulting in falls over the railing;
- Ensure that your balcony railings are not more than 10 cm (4 inch) apart. This will eliminate access between the vertical bars of a

balcony, or deck.

#### Further prevention tips

- Toddlers & preschoolers are at highest risk of falling from a window, or balcony, but it may happen at any age;
- Direct supervision of children is the single most effective way to prevent falls from windows and balconies:
- Install safety devices which limit the distance in which a window be can open to a maximum of 10cm (4 inches);
- Ensure the safety device can be released quickly, so the window can be used for escape in case of emergency.
- Consider purchasing a portable air conditioner, which will enable windows to stay closed & secure.





The first night was freezing cold but still brought in about 650 visitors. The second night had about 2000! The test event was so successful that Vivo immediately began talking about holding the event in 2018.

This year, the Night Market North will be held every other Friday all summer long – from 5-9pm on Jun 8 & 22, July 6 & 20, and Aug 10 & 24. There will be food trucks, kids games, entertainment, and lots of booths full of great deals and interesting finds operated by your neighbors in the community. "Expected attendance is to average around 2500 per night, but we are hoping to exceed that with your help (We are still looking for sponsors!)", quips Ian, demonstrating that this

is truly a community initiative for northern hills residents and businesses.






