Tree Planting in Coventry Hills

The 15th Pathfinders from the Calgary Area Girl Guides - Deerfoot District, and their families planted six fruit trees in the Coventry Community Gardens, located at 90 Covepark Square, on the evening of June 8th. The purchase of the trees was made possible by a \$500 grant awarded to the Pathfinder unit by TD Friends of the Environment Foundation through the GGC Tree Planting Program. The project "Make Calgary Great Again!" works to enhance environmental awareness of the girls, improve the local environment of the community, and allows the girls to feel proud of the work they have done to improve the environment. The girls have been working on their Canada Cord Award for the past two years, and this service project will count towards this prestigious

accolade.

The trees planted included a Courageous Crab Apple, Fall Red Apple, Golden Spice Pear, Romeo Cherry, Valentine Cherry, and a Brookgold Plum. The fruit will be edible and available to the community when it matures in the fall.

The NHCA would like to thank the 15th Pathfinders for choosing our community gardens to donate their grant money and time to. The girls (and their parents) worked hard to prepare the area and dig the holes for the tress to be planted in. They for sure learned some skill in pushing full wheelbarrows and digging out grass! The girls will also be taking care of the trees on a weekly basis over the summer to endure the trees are hydrated. This donation to our community association is an invaluable addition to our community.

Many thanks to Jody Miller with Urban Forestry, City of Calgary who coordinated the purchase and delivery of the trees, irrigation and utility locates, and delivery of mulch. Jody also gave an educational talk on safety, as well as gave a demonstration on how to plant and care for fruit

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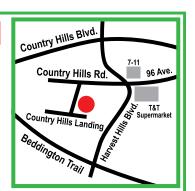
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From the Executive

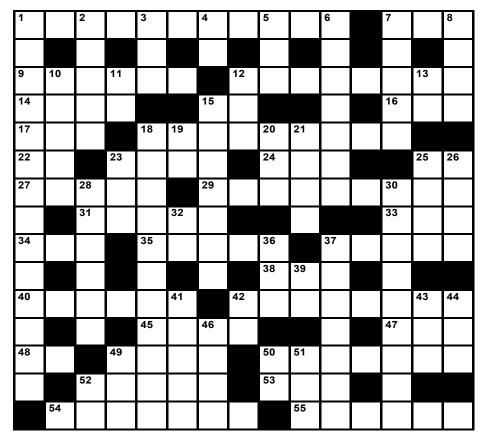

Be Yard Smart

A message from the City of Calgary

A beautiful yard and conserving water go hand-in-hand.

During the summer, your water use can jump by 50 per cent because of outdoor watering activities. This increased demand places a strain on our rivers and treatment plants. Save water, money and time by adopting a few simple water saving tips.

- · Watch your weather forecast to determine if you should water or not. Adjust your watering schedule accordingly and skip watering when it has rained or is forecast to rain.
- The best time to water is early in the morning. Avoid watering in the heat of the day (10 a.m. to 3 p.m.).

- An easy way to water in the morning is to add a timer to your sprinkler or set your irrigation system.
- Capture rain water in a rain barrel and use it on your trees, shrubs and flower beds.
- Use the right watering tool for the job. Keep water low and slow to ensure water reaches the plant roots and does not just evaporate.
- Reduce mowing and watering by keeping your lawn at least two or three inches high. Taller grass shades the soil, so it requires less water and stays healthier.

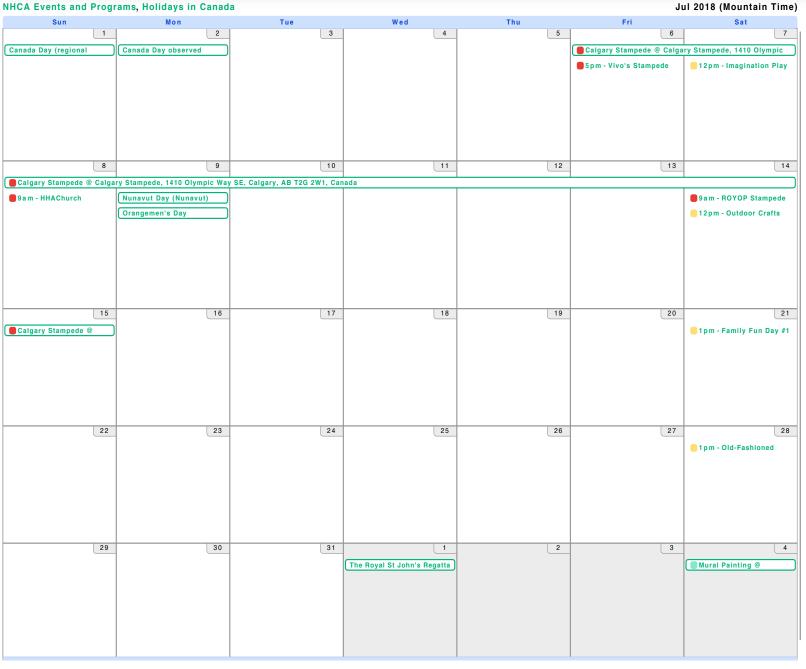

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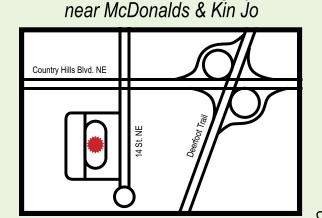
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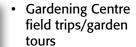
The Northern Hills Gardeners

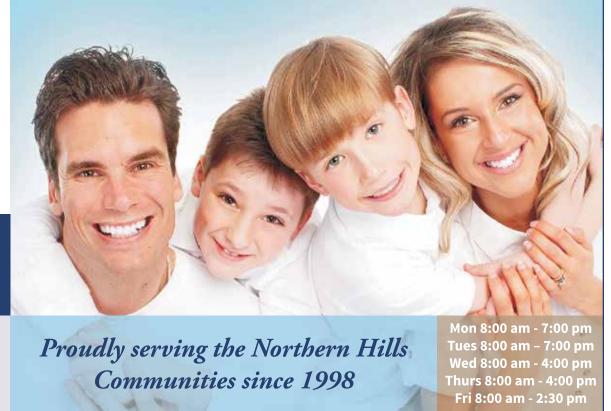






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Hello Panorama Hills!!!!

Congratulations to the 150 or so residents that attended the Panorama Residents **Association Annual** General Meeting. That is an amazing turnout for an AGM and shows an engaged membership. However, what many quickly learned, was that some of the issues they wanted to discuss, were actually issues for the Northern Hills Community Association, which had a very low turnout at its' AGM in April.



Depending on where you live in Panorama, you are likely a member of the Northstar Resident's Association or the Panorama Hill's Estates Homeowners Association. Both of these associations charge mandatory fees that you must pay if you live within their catchment and each provides different services for that fee.

What most people do not realize, is that the Northern Hills Community Association is your local community association. There is a separate membership fee for this and our services are completely different from the other mentioned associations. Our fees are not mandatory and membership is voluntary. We are also different from the Nose Creek Sports and Recreation Association, which operates Vivo. If you were not confused before, you might be now. Each one of these organizations is a non-profit offering value to our community but in different ways.

While many people are familiar with our community soccer and adult softball, NHCA membership is also what provides you advocacy with elected officials and city departments, blockwatch, community beautification, and community events (often in conjunction with the Northstar Residents Association, or Vivo, which is NOT a community

centre). The NHCA also provides you with significant discounts at local businesses in return for having a membership with us. The NHCA produces this newsletter every month with volunteers and community contributions.

The NHCA has been addressing traffic problems brought to our attention; The wetland naturalization project thanks to residents reaching out to us; Discussions on a community ice rink; Supporting a school playground build; Rallies for the public high school that was in the Capital Plans to be built in 2005; Pushing for the community health centre that was approved in 2005 and never built, and trying to be creative in getting community meeting space. We are always trying to do more, but we depend on memberships, volunteers, and the type of engagement shown at the Northstar AGM.

It gives us pleasure to say that strong relationships have been formed between the NHCA, Northstar Residents Association and Vivo and perhaps we are doing so well working together, it is hard to distinguish the differences so hopefully this explains it better. new community growth in Calgary. This topic is complex and critical to the successful delivery of Ward 3's infrastructure needs. We've often been told that our communities will see improvements to our infrastructure - like roads, recreation, transit, health care, schools - when we have more density. As the ward that contains some of the most rapidly growing neighbourhoods in the last decade, that argument is often tough for us to swallow because we have seen our population swell

over time, unaccompanied by necessary infrastructure.

That's why I'm carefully reviewing the merits of the business cases for community growth that will be presented to us, so that I can advocate for the industrial and commercial employment hubs that complement our predominantly residential communities. By bringing on growth areas north of Stoney Trail and west into Ward 2, we can ask for our forgotten infrastructure needs to be addressed through new development. This could mean completion of interchanges, activation of right-of-ways, proper entry and exit points into communities, and expansion to our regional recreational facility. While those are the local improvements I will be fighting for, new growth will further facilitate our ability to press the provincial government

off the table. The risk with respect to the project has not decreased because those that oppose the project will continue to oppose it, the B.C. government will continue to stand in the way, and the court cases will continue to cause delays.

That is why I have been calling on the government to use its existing power to advance this project. Solutions could include using section 92(10)(c) of the Constitution Act and declare the construction of this pipeline a benefit to all Canadians, and expediting the judicial challenges. These are options that exist today that would allow private investment to stay in Canada and would aid in the construction of the new pipeline.

When recreating in wooded or grassy areas, reduce the risk of tick bites by covering up; using bug spray with DEET, IR3535 or Icaridin; and checking for ticks once you are back inside. If you find a tick on yourself, remove it using tweezers and submit it in a sealed container to an Environmental Public Health Office, a First Nations Health Centre, or a doctor. In this way, Alberta's tick surveillance program will monitor whether ticks able to cause Lyme disease are present in the province. To date, the risk of contracting Lyme disease in Alberta remains low.

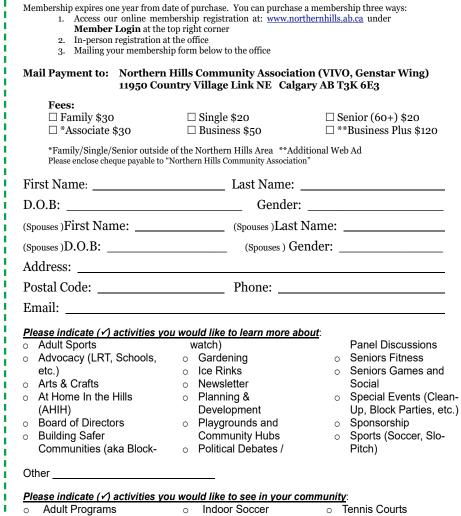

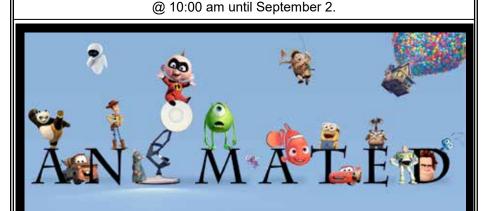

What is 'Risky Play' and why do kids need it?

(adapted from outsideplay.ca by Calgary NW Early **Childhood Coalitions**)

Play is a basic childhood need, and taking risks is a necessary part of that play. Whether jumping into a pile of leaves, climbing trees, or playing street hockey, children are often happier when they are playing. These kinds of experiences are a lot less common for kids today. Our worries and desire to protect our kids can result in setting too many limits on them, which can interfere with healthy development. Risky play (or what used to

just be called 'play') can take many different shapes, but always involves the thrill and excitement of testing yourself, pushing limits, and finding out what happens.

These are some of the types of play that are deemed 'risky':

- Playing with heights
- Playing at high speeds
- Playing with tools
- Playing near elements - Playing with a perceived chance of getting lost
- Rough and tumble play Increasingly, research is showing that risky play is im-

portant for children's health, development, and wellbeing; kids can build resilience, self-esteem, become more physically active, develop their social skills and selfconfidence, and learn how to manage risks and keep themselves safe.

Did you know?

- Just 37% of children play outside everyday
- Only 7% of kids under 10 are allowed to go out on their own

Heat Related Illness

With the return of summer weather, EMS would like to remind everyone to stay safe in the heat and sun this season. While children and the elderly may be more susceptible to the effects of heat and sun, basic prevention measures should be taken by all to avoid a heat related illness during periods of hot and humid weather.

Heat exhaustion

- Heat exhaustion can occur due to excessive fluid loss during periods of prolonged sweating in a hot and/or humid environment (indoors or outdoors);
- Patients may suffer headaches, weakness, fatigue, nausea/vomiting, thirst, chills, and profuse sweating;
- The patient is usually cold and damp to the touch and the skin may appear pale, or dusky gray.

Heat stroke

- Heat stroke is a medical emergency which, without prompt treatment, could be fatal;
- It occurs when the body can't cool itself naturally (e.g. perspiration). The body's temperature will continue to rise to dangerous levels;
- Due to severe dehydration and the inability to sweat, the patient may appear flushed, and skin may be hot and dry to the touch.

First aid

 First aid for all heat related illness begins with removing or sheltering the patient from the hot environment;

- Remove excess, or tight fitting clothing, and allow them to rest in a cool environment;
- If the patient is conscious and alert, provide suitable fluids such as: water, juice, or a sports drink:
- If you are concerned, seek medical attention or call 9-1-1.

Prevention

- · Stay well-hydrated by drinking plenty of water;
- · Be aware that excessive alcohol consumption

will promote dehydration;

- Always wear a broad brimmed hat to keep the sun off your face and neck;
- Apply a broad spectrum, waterproof sunscreen with a minimum SPF of 30+, especially for children. The sun's UV rays peak between 11am-3pm, even on cloudy days.









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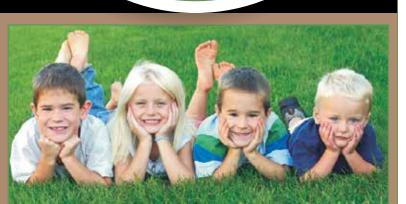
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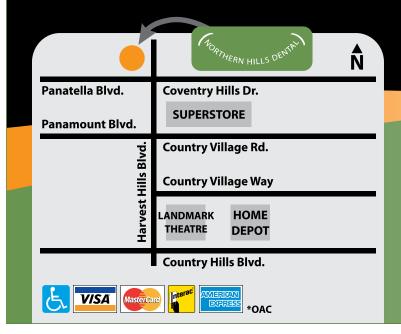
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
