

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

Provincial Election is Coming!



Rumours are swirling that a provincial election might be closer than expected. By the time you read this, the writ may have already dropped, as the legislation states that the election will fall between March 1st and May 31st of this year, unless the Lieutenant Governor dissolves the Legislature earlier. Realistically, it likely will not occur until at least after the Speech From The Throne on March 18th.

However, candidates are likely already knocking at your door from each of the parties. In case you are unaware, our current district Northern Hills, will be split in three different districts: Calgary Beddington for those in Country Hills; Calgary North for those in Panorama Hills; and Calgary Northeast for those in Coventry Hills, Country Hills Village and Harvest Hills. The nomination processes are not completed for each party in each district at the time of publication so we are unable to provide you with a complete list.

We suggest having a list of questions near your front door for when the candidates come looking for your support. Even if you know which party you plan on voting for, this is your opportunity to find out if that candidate is connected to issues important to you.

- You will have your own questions, but here are some questions that we collected from a variety of sources:
- Do you live within the district? If not, why are you running here?
- ✔ What would you say is the most important issue here based on door knocking?
- ✔ What is your position on the North Calgary High School?
- ✓ Did you know that a North Calgary Urgent Care Centre was approved in 2005 and still hasn't been built? Would you make this



a priority?

- It is believed the valley east of Coventry Hills and Harvest Hills is the original Calgary-Edmonton Wagon Trail and may still have historical artifacts. If this is correct, do you believe this valley should be protected and turned into a provincial park?
- ✓ What are you going to do to get the Greenline built to North Pointe?
- How are you going to improve transit service in the area?
- ✓ What are you going to do about class sizes?
- ✓ What are your thoughts on the provincial mill rate (education taxes) on our property taxes?
- ✓ What are your thoughts on the paper health care cards?
- ✓ What motivated you to run?
- ✓ What do you hope to accomplish in your first term?
- ✓ What is your position on pipe-
- ✓ What new ideas do you bring to the next government?
- ✔ What is your feeling on carbon
- ✓ What is your opinion on gaystraight alliances in schools?
- ✔ What is your opinion on the current minimum wage?

- If you could change one thing in government bureaucracy, what would it be?
- ✓ The Calgary economy continues to struggle. Do you have a plan to address this?
- ✓ Should there be more support for those on AISH?
- ✓ Is the mental health system working in Alberta?
- If elected, do your constituents come first? Or your party?

- ✓ What change has the current government made that you think was good for Albertans?
- What change has the current government made that you think was bad for Albertans?
- ✓ What is your position on taxpayers funding private schools? Charter Schools?
- Are you planning on cutting taxes or raising taxes?
- Where would you make cuts to the budget?
- If elected, what would you do if you felt your party lacked integrity?

What are your questions? We would love to know them. The NHCA hopes to hold a candidate forum once the election is called so watch for information in the newsletter, Facebook, Twitter, and BRITE signs if they are available.





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

Embrace Your Smarts

Interview with Alexia Sabau, Coventry Hills resident and Canada's Smartest Person Junior finalist

Alexia is 13 years old grade 8 student and a resident of Coventry Hills neighbourhood here in North Central Calgary. After a nationwide search she was one of the 12 remarkable young individu-

young individuals who were chosen to compete for the title of Canada's Smartest Person Junior. She represented Calgary and the whole Alberta on the CBC's competition series - Canada's Smartest Person Junior. Wow!

YS – How did you appear to be among these 12 smart individuals? What was your journey and how did it help you to become one of these competitors?

AS - It started with my mum hearing about Canada's Smartest Person Junior on a radio. She thought it would be perfect for me and encouraged me to apply. I filled up the forms and submitted my one-minute video about myself. Next, they started to select kids to do multiple stages of interviews and tests on intelligence in Toronto. It was a lot of fun talking to the cast, directors, and producers. The whole process took about a month.

I went to a gifted school back in the United States where I learnt the ways to remember things and keep my brain engaged in everything I do. Also, my talent as a junior reporter helped me to meet the candidate's criteria. I had to embrace everything that I learnt!

My first reporting thing was with a small local company where I used to live back in the United States. Also, when I was little, I played around the house with a microphone. When we moved to Calgary, I started with Calgary International Children's Festival. Then I won a contest

through Calgary Stampede as a junior reporter and started to evolve my Alexia in YYC

junior reporter YouTube channel. There I have some of my older interviews as I used to do it with Shaw TV and now, I will continue the channel on my own. After that I started my social media

pages - @jr_reporteryyc on Instagram and Twitter and Alexia in YYC on Facebook.

My reporting is focused on kids, family, and cultural events. As there are so many events happenings and many people don't know about them. I always go to the events, activities, and initiatives that I report about. There I trial everything myself. I also like to target my talks to kids of my age as I want to give an experience from a child's eye, so that other kids can relate to me. I post a lot of content on my social media about the events I go to. There are so many cool things that I have been part of, and they helped me to get where I am now.

YS – We know you competed till the end and were in the final round. Congratulations! Even though the victory slipped away at the end. What was it like at the contest? How would you describe your experience throughout the Canada's Smartest Person Junior contest?

AS – It was an amazing experience! We had a lot of fun with each other. Every day I learnt something new from the show itself and from the kids. I also learnt a lot of things about myself and how I can handle under stress and pressure. It was a cool experience to be on the set of such big TV show and learn how they do things at the show and behind the scene.

The contest was based on the theory of multiple intelligences. There are 6 categories of intelligence and we were tested on all 6 of them: linguistic, musical, social, logical, physical, and visual. It is a very cool theory, and I believe it should be incorporated more often. Not everyone is very good at every subject, everyone has their own thing that appeals to them. When you like one subject more, then you can learn better in that subject because you actually want to be good at it.

YS – How was your experience with other kids? Competitive?

AS - It was all good! We had a friendly competition. We all hang out outside of the show. There was never a real dispute between us. It was a friendly competition. Everyone was aiming for the title of Canada's **Smartest Person** but we all still stayed friends throughout the whole contest. Now we have our own group chat and follow each other on the social media.

YS - Where do you see yourself now? What are your next steps? Let's say in the next 10 years.

AS – I want to continue with

my reporting and want to continue helping, involving, and educating other families and kids. Helping kids to embrace their smarts. I really want to start doing that. Because I think most kids have smarts that they don't know about. They just need to embrace them and voice them. I want to inspire kids to do that. In the further future, I really want to still go on with my reporting and want to have a talk show on a major network. Also, I am interested in science. I want to be a doctor. And I would like to do both, being a reporter and a doctor.

YS – Are there any events projects in the near future?

AS – I am doing a lot of events with science, such as Cybermentor and Beakerhead. I am surprised, many people don't know about Beakerhead, as it is such a big thing. I like telling people about it. There you can learn about science in all kind of different ways. It is STEAM – Science, Technology, Educations, Arts, and Math. I have been involved with them for the past three years, and I am part of their social media team.

Also, I take part in Calgary Performing Arts Festival. I play piano and couple of other way grow a community. Trust yourself. You know more than you think. Embrace it and you can do anything! I like more actual social

I like more actual social things in real life, hands on stuff, like going to festivals. Social media is a great way to spread out to more people







instruments, and sing. I do a lot of things related to arts around Calgary. A lot of festivals here are arts oriented.

YS – What would you tell someone who is just recognizing their smart potentials?

AS – I think if they want to inspire other kids like I do, then social media is a great way to do that. And voicing your opinion, whether that's going to debates or other events. Another way to start out is to start a blog. Just do what you like and don't be afraid to show off all your smarts. As a lot of kids think about these stereotypes, but really when you embrace your smarts it can help you to inspire other people and help you do lots of things. Say what you feel and do what you like. Then you can inspire people who like the same things as you, and you can meet people who like the same things as you, and that

but also meeting new people in real life. You need to be social in real life as well. It doesn't all have to be in social media. You have to know how to find that balance between social media and real life.

I would like to give a shout out to the whole community and my school for all their support throughout the whole contest process! One of my Grade 6 teachers, they still tell me every day that I am a superstar, and other teachers are showing videos in class of my interviews and episodes from the show. It was great to have so much support from the community! Thank you!

Do you know the signs and symptoms of a heart attack and what to do if someone experiences these? Knowing, may make the difference between life and death. Recognizing and responding immediately to the warning signs of a potential heart attack may significantly improve survival and recovery. February is Heart Month: take the time to be heart safe and learn how you can reduce your risk.

Common signs of a heart attack(Any, or all, of these signs & symp-



- Chest discomfort described as simply a mild pressure up to a 'crushing' pain; may also be 'squeezing' or simply a 'heavy' sensation;
- Discomfort may move to the shoulders, arm, neck, or jaw;
- May include shortness of breath, sweating, or nausea / vomiting.
- Signs may vary person to person and can differ between men and women, and the elderly.

Heart attack Risk Factors

- Obesity*
- Sedentary lifestyle*
- Smoking*
- High cholesterol*



Family history

Speak with your doctor about how to treat your modifiable (*) risk factors and learn to be heart safe.

What to do when seconds count

- Call 9-1-1 immediately. Early treatment can greatly reduce heart damage and make the difference of life and death;
- Treatment starts the moment EMS arrives. Paramedics can provide oxygen, start an intravenous and perform an electrocardiogram (ECG);
- Paramedics can also administer important medication(s) in the early minutes of a heart attack to lessen heart damage;
- During transport, EMS will share information with the hospital so that definitive treatment can begin immediately upon arrival;
- Take a CPR / AED course. Training is widely available from many reputable organizations.
 It's easy and could make a significant difference in the outcome of someone experiencing a heart attack.







Stay Alert and Aware During a Power Outage


Power outages can happen any time of the year but are especially dangerous during the cold winter months. They can last for minutes, hours and sometimes even days.

"The best way to stay safe in a power outage, is to be prepared," says Sue Henry, Deputy Chief at Calgary Emergency Management Agency. "Have a fully stocked 72 hour kit including flashlights, blankets and non-perishable food. It's also important to have a plan for any medications that require power to be administered that are powered by electricity or need to be refrigerated."

While temperatures may drop, it is never safe to use camp stoves, kerosene heaters or barbeques indoors, as they emit <u>carbon monoxide</u>. Gas stoves used as a heat source for long periods of time without ventilation will also pose a danger.

Electrical equipment and appliances can be overloaded when the power is turned back on, so it's a good idea to disconnect them. Be sure to leave one light on, so you know when the power has been restored!

A fully charged power bank is invaluable during a power outage. This will allow you to charge your



smartphone so you can check for updates on the internet, and contact family members.




Did You Know? Renovations at Community Libraries


