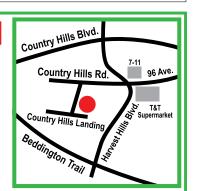

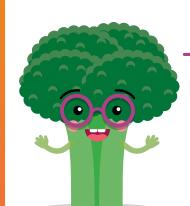

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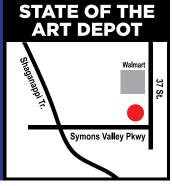

Science Project Tiny Homes

By Grade 3/4 Students, Buffalo Rubbing Stone School

What is a tiny home? How can we help homeless veterans? We are going to tell you about what we did and what this is all about.

Homes for Heroes was our inspiration!

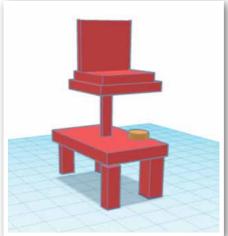
They're building 18 tiny homes in Calgary to help homeless veterans. It will have a communal building so families can visit, and they can have space to meet and help one another.

Our whole class talked about tiny homes and the Mustard Seed. We talked about what does the Mustard Seed do for homeless people. They help homeless people find a job. They also help homeless people with medical issues and send people to different places if the Mustard Seed isn't the right place for them. Someone from the Mustard Seed, named Ms. Brittany, came to our class to tell us about how homelessness happens and how we can help.

We also made a tiny home with tape on the floor to separate all the rooms. Each group made a piece of furniture and we had a specific spot to place it within the tape. It was the size of a real tiny home!

Then a teacher from our school who was good with technology and construction came and helped. His name is Mr. Blais. We had to go through a whole planning process to design a piece of furniture that could be used for more than one purpose. One thing we had to think about was if a veteran could use our furniture. First, we had to think of a design, interview a partner and listen to their feedback about our design for the





veteran. Second, we had to draw our design using our partners feedback, interview a partner again and then drew our final design. Third, we had to build our prototype, interview a partner once again to see how it would work with their disability (for example, they were in a wheelchair, had P.T.S.D., or needed a guide dog). Lastly, we had to tweak our design if they couldn't use it properly and the design was finished.

Students have worked so hard to make tiny home furniture! We saw a lot of videos about what we were doing and recorded a lot of research notes in our visual journals. These prototypes that you see in the photos took us a long time to design. Look at our prototypes! We hope you enjoy it!!!

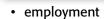

At Home In the Hills (AHIH) committee of NHCA is excited to announce the successful completion of the first ever Free Community Income Tax Clinic in the Northern Hills. Our Tax Clinic ran from 16th March to 13th April, 2019, at the NHCA Office in Vivo Complex. We were open on Tuesdays from 6pm to 8pm and on Saturdays from 12pm to 4pm. We took clients on walk-in basis and appointments booked in person. We were able to successfully complete more than 25 tax returns. This Tax Clinic was part of the Community Volunteer Income Tax Program (CV-ITP) which promotes the idea of "People helping People".

CVITP is a collaboration between Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) and Community organizations. Under CVITP, Community Organizations arrange for volunteers who can prepare tax returns for eligible individuals who have modest income and a simple tax situation. According to CRA, a simple tax situation is if you have no income or if your income comes from these sources:





- pension
- benefits such as Canada Pension Plan, disability, employment insurance, social assistance
- registered retirement savings plans (RRSP's)
- support payments
- scholarships, fellowships, bursaries or grants
- interest (under \$1,000)

As per CRA rules, we were unable to serve individuals having:

- self-employment or employment expenses
- rental income
- · interest income over \$1,000
- capital gains or losses
- · foreign property
- filed bankruptcy
- cases of deceased per-

According to the CVITP guidelines, AHIH Team

recruited interested community members as volunteers after initial interviews. These volunteers were then screened for suitability by CRA. Our team of 15 volunteers then

went through CRA's training webinars, in-person training by AHIH Team and some hands-on practice sessions on the UFile software used for preparing tax returns. AHIH and our energetic Tax Clinic volunteers had an amazing experience this tax season. It was a great feeling to be able to connect to the residents, support them and help them file their taxes for free. We held a Volunteer Appreciation

party on the last day of our Tax Clinic to recognize the hard-work of the volunteers and celebrated our success together. This ending marks the beginning of a great new journey for AHIH to work on more such projects in future and help us thrive as a strong community. See you next year!!!

New high school for north central Calgary

Over the last decade, the communities of Northern Hills have been overlooked in terms

of much needed pedestrian and transportation solutions to meet the needs of community members. With the support and feedback of residents and the NHCA in the past year, we have been able to celebrate a number of big wins that will have a positive impact on our communities. For example, we all stand to benefit from

the funding that has been secured to complete and improve the interchanges along Stoney Trail at 11th Street NE, Centre Street and 14th Street NW.

We have also partnered with residents and different community organizations to improve the pedestrian experience in our neighborhoods. Two recent examples include:

- The installation of traffic calming curbs along Covepark Drive and at Coventry Hills Way by Coventry Hills School; and
- The relocation of the bus zone originally located within the curb extensions on Harvest Hills Drive, 60 meters north toward Harvest Grove Place.

There are three additional installations coming this spring as follows:

 The placement of a Rectangular Rapid Flash Beacon (RRFB) at Panatella Boulevard and Panamount Street by Captain Nichola Goddard School;

- A new mid-block crossing connecting the pathway west of Panatella Boulevard and Panatella Close, complete with curb extensions to shorten the crossing distance for pedestrians; and
- The narrowing of traffic lanes at the pedestrian crossing along Country Hills Drive at Country Hills Gate.

These important pedestrian and transportation upgrades are a result of a collaborative effort from community members and the City of Calgary. Our office is happy to be a conduit to

ensure our communities are finally getting the attention they deserve. We value and appreciate your perspectives as we continue with our commitment to advocate for the needs of north central Calgary. 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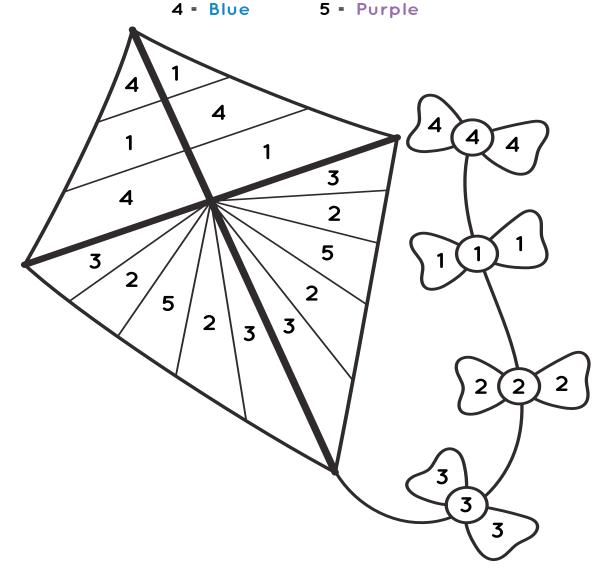

HEALTH CORNER



Window & Balcony Safety

With the return of warmer weather, Emergency Medical Services (EMS) would like to remind parents and caregivers of an often overlooked hazard in the home – access to open windows. Every year, paramedics respond to emergencies where a child has fallen from an open window, often from the second floor. These can be avoided by following safety measures. Take the time to assess potential hazards in your home before a preventable fall occurs.

Windows and screens

- · Prevent access to windows by moving furniture such as cribs, beds, stools, and change tables out from under them;
- Keep drapery cords out of childrens' reach. Wrap excess cord around cleats, or tie-downs to avoid a choking hazard;

Remember, screens are not safety devices. They are designed to keep bugs out, not children in.

Balconies

- Do not underestimate a child's ability to climb. Furniture and other items stored on balconies and decks can be used to climb resulting in falls over the railing;
- Ensure that your balcony railings are not more than 10 cm (4 inch) apart. This will eliminate access between the vertical bars of a balcony, or deck.

Further prevention tips

- Toddlers & preschoolers are at highest risk of falling from a window, or balcony, but it may happen at any age;
- Direct supervision of children is the single most effective way to

prevent falls from windows and balconies;

- Install safety devices which limit the distance in which a window be can open to a maximum of 10cm (4 inches);
- Ensure the safety device can be released quickly, so the window can be used for escape in case of emergency.
- Consider purchasing a portable air conditioner, which will enable windows to stay closed &

Coventry Hills Drive NE)... Thanks to

a \$15.000 donation from Northern Hills Community Association, we now have enough funding to build the first phase: the regulation-sized basketball court! Woohoo! This means we will be starting work this summer on this project, and letters will be going out to residents on the traffic circle to let them know about the work that will be happening, as soon as we have some tentative dates.

Fundraising is continuing for the rink part of the project, and by the time you receive this newsletter, we will have applied for two grants to help us reach our target. We still need to raise the matching funding though, so any little donations from residents help! You can donate through our Parks Foundation account at: https://www.parksfdn.com/sport-projects and donations made online all receive a charitable donation tax receipt.

On to Project 2: Five SE Coventry Parks!

This group of parks is older than

others in Coventry Hills, and the current equipment will need to be removed within the next few years once it becomes unsafe to use. The five parks in this project are shown in the map here:

Parks 4 & 8 have recently been renovated, with their playgrounds being replaced like-for-like as tot lots,



because they couldn't wait for the engagement and community co-creation to finish. As all of the parks are easily walkable from any of the other park spaces in this group of five, activities aimed at making this area suitable for ALL AGES have been selected to replace the aging playgrounds currently in parks 3, 5 & 6. These activities were chosen in accordance with the "Six Big Ideas for Coventry Hills" themes in the Creating Coventry report (download at: www.northernhills.ab.ca/creating-coventry), and ideas for parks in this specific group of five, using data gathered from community resident

engagements during 2017 & 2018.

Community Choices: The Results!

As you can see from the charts, the first choices of location were absolutely clear for the top two activities: parkour & climbing wall (Park 3: Red Slide Park) and a natural playground (Park 5: Twin Park).

As mentioned above, there are already two new tot lots in Parks 4 and 8.

BUT... what should we do for Park 6?

We can't have two parks exactly the same, so to round out the SE Coventry area with a variety of activities for everyone, we're asking: Please let us know your answers by any of the following methods:

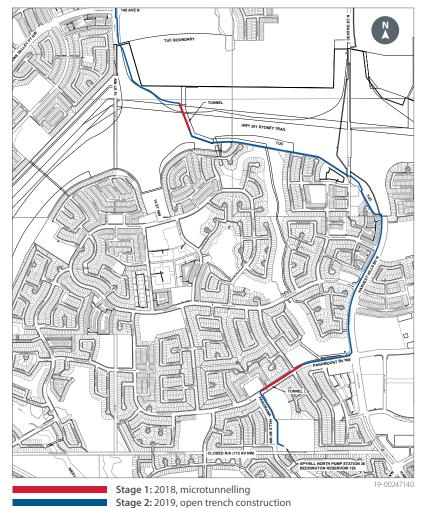

Spring has sprung, and with it comes an increase in yard waste. Weekly green cart collection will resume the first week of April.

There are no changes to blue or black cart collection.

Coexisting with Bobcats

With a bobbed tail, Bobcats are small compared to other wild cats. They weigh in around 20lbs. Their front striped legs meet large webbed paws. Whiskers cross a black barred snout with signature black ear tufts. They are strict carnivores hunting small mammals, insects and birds. Little evidence suggests they eat substantial amounts of domestic pets.

If you do not want Bobcats around your property, eliminate shelter options. Areas under your deck or shed provide a good hiding place for Bobcats and prey, remove access to the attractive accommodation. Brush or piles of rubbish encourage small mammal presence inviting predators in for a meal. Feed your pets indoors and remove bird feeders. However, some welcome the guests.

Bobcats are crepuscular, meaning active at twilight. This behaviour changes seasonally with prey activity increasing in colder months to the day. In urban environments Bobcats often lean towards a nocturnal lifestyle to avoid human interaction.

Bobcats have an average territory ranging up to 5 km2. Territorial size fluctuates among individuals depending on prey abundance, mates and denning habitat. Home ranges are also influenced by population densities with smaller territories where there are more Bobcats.

Given their wide range and localized healthy populations, they are not endangered, however



they are extirpated, or locally extinct, in many areas across North America. Trapping has led to their disappearance. Here in Alberta it is prohibited to

rehabilitate orphaned or injured bobcats, Fish and Wildlife leave orphaned kittens to starve to death allowing "nature to take its course" with the mother dependent milk drinking mammals rarely orphaned from natural circumstances. Bobcats are successfully rehabilitated and released in other jurisdictions.

"We are so fortunate to share our community with Bobcats. They have chosen to coexist with us. Bobcats benefit our urban environment bringing balance to our partially paved ecosystem" - Lisa Dahlseide B.Sc.

Lisa Dahlseide is a Conservation Biologist living in Bowness whose focus is on Wildlife Biology. She volunteers at the Cochrane Ecological Institute as the Director of Education teaching about the importance of Wildlife Rehabilitation and Release and she works for the Weaselhead/ Glenmore Park Preservation Society teaching environmental education programs and monitoring the impacts of the SW Calgary Ring

Road on wildlife and water.

Storm drains in your Community

Storm drains (or catch basins) are a part of Calgary's stormwater drainage system. There are about 60,000 drains in Calgary which drain water off sidewalks, streets and roads.

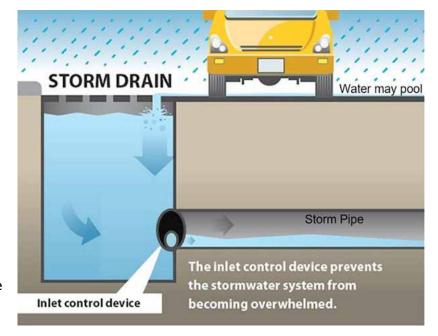
Keep your storm drains free and clear of snow and debris

If it is safe and possible to do, remove debris or snow blocking the drain. Create a channel, if need be, to facilitate water flow. If you find that the storm drain is iced over, do not try to remove the ice yourself. Call 311 and a crew will clear the ice for you. Don't chip away at ice on storm drains as you may damage it or injure yourself.

Pooled water on your street In communities built after 1990, The City installs devices in the storm drain to control how fast water flows into the system. During and after a rainfall event, these devices allow water to pool on the road (usually in a depression or low spot, called a Trap Low), until the system can accept the extra water. These devices prevent the storm system from being overwhelmed, which can cause water backups or flooding to houses, garages and businesses.

Pooled water will eventually drain. If water is pooled on a roadway, but is not causing a safety or property damage concern, only contact 311 if the water has not drained after 120 minutes.

Homeowner responsibility Your property's drainage systems (eavestroughs, downspouts, lot grading, landscaping)



interact with the public drainage systems (roadways, storm drains, stormpipes, storm ponds). Homeowners have responsibilities that are detailed in the Lot Drainage Bylaw, the Drainage **Bylaw and Community Standards** Bylaw:

Maintaining positive drainage on your lot - away from structures without adverse effect to neighbours or public property.

Ensuring prohibited substances do not enter storm drains from your lot. There are substantial fines for the dumping or pouring material down storm

Protecting your Home There are many ways you can ensure your home is resilient during storm events:

Conduct regular maintenance and clear debris in eavestroughs and downspouts.

Ensure downspouts discharge a minimum of 2 metres from public infrastructure (sidewalks & pathways), 1-2 m from any building foundations, and are directed towards the street, lane or swale, while not impacting your neighbours or public property.

Keep any grassed or concrete swales on your property free from debris, ice or obstructions.

Regularly inspect grading around your foundation and fill any settling or depressions.

Conduct regular maintenance on sump pumps. Ensure sump pumps discharge away from 1-2 m from building foundations, while not impacting your neighbour or public infrastructure.

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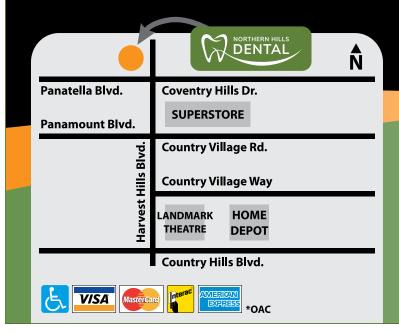
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
