

This November, City Council made some significant decisions around our operating budget based on a motion that I put forward with Councillor Colley-Urquhart. First, we directed Admin-



istration to engage a third-party and report back by November 2020 with operating budget savings of \$24 million and a further \$50 million for 2021 and 2022, respectively. This will mean

a future drop of \$74 million in the operating budget which directly impacts all property owners in the city. Because internal efforts at seeking efficiencies have been exhausted, an experienced external perspective will be valuable.

Next, we preserved much-needed transit hours, the low income transit pass, and police and fire service through the use of interest earned on City investments, instead of adding to taxpayer's property tax bills for 2020 and 2021. Given the number of Calgarians who are out of work or in positions of vulnerability, cutting our service levels was counterintuitive to getting people back on their feet. In a nutshell, we were able to hold the operating budget to 2019 levels (0%

increase) by finding bridge financing for services while directing a total of \$74 million in reductions for future operating budgets.

Finally, we made a long overdue change in the proportional share of responsibility for operating budget between residential and non-residential properties. Historically, non-residential (or business) properties have been responsible for up to 55% of the operating budget while homeowners covered 45%. Because non-residential properties only generate about 20% of the revenue stream from property taxes, this has resulted in a lopsided system that has increased property taxes for businesses to a level where they have had to cut jobs or close their doors. To

address this, we approved a proportional share of 52% for approximately 500,000 residential properties and 48% for about 15,000 non-residential properties to keep Calgarians in business and employed.

Although, project completion is the one true measure of success, it's important to celebrate achievements along the way. The Trans Mountain Expansion Project is not only a step forward for

This project has created more than 2200 jobs as of September 2019, including Indigenous peoples, local and regional employees. Adding new consumer protection tools to those already available highlights the government's commitment to modernizing services and ensuring an appropriate balance between protecting consumers and creating an environment where job creators can thrive.

Business Enforcement Search: Allows consumers free access to the history of enforcement actions against a business.

Consumer Alerts Program: Alberta. ca issues proactive warnings about dishonest businesses. Report a Rip-off tip line 1-877-427-4088. Anonymous tips line allows consumers and businesses to report suspicious or dishonest activities.

What makes a Business a Social Business?

Or, what is a social business or social enterprise? In all fairness, there's a whole debate and spectrum of what constitutes a social business and it could appear to be quite complicated, but it doesn't have to be.

In essence, a social business is a business that seeks to address social challenges in the community through the selling of their products and services. A social business or social enterprise balances People and Profits to make the world a better place.

What does that really mean? Well, there are many social challenges in Calgary that your business can help with. "Again, what do you mean by social challenges?" I thought I heard you ask that.

Social challenges are those barriers that stand in the way of all of us living in an equal and inclusive community or economy. Some of the barriers may be unaffordable childcare, minimum wage not paying the bills, not getting enough hours at work, having a disability (either mental or physical or both), having a health condition, access to transit, education, and the list goes on. There are just so many problems out there.

But wait, your business can help solve and prevent these problems! Your business can create change in the community to create a more

inclusive economy. You don't have to register as a non-profit or social business (even though you can't even register as a social business, yet), to be called a social business. Basically, any business can create change in their community by addressing these social challenges.

A social enterprise balances both being profitable in business with providing maximum benefits to the people of the community. It does not exploit people, but harnesses their strengths to build a stronger business and community. A non-profit or char-

ity emphasizes people and providing services for people, not a big emphasis on business principles though. Social business blends the two in some capacity.

How Can You Make Changes within Your Business to be More Social?

Take Ashley for example. Ashley has been a stay at home mom to

her 3 young kids for years. She has dedicated her life to her kids. Plus, she can't afford the \$900+ per month, per child, to put in daycare so she can work at a minimum wage job. Just to pay for daycare, she'd have to make \$2700, let alone pay for food and rent. But what if Ashley walked into your business, and she looked like she might be the perfect employee for you? You could hire her at a living wage, or more to whatever would make it affordable for her to work for you, and maybe provide a couple of benefits for her and her

family. Because you believe that she will help you grow your business, you take the risk and pay her a decent wage and benefits. Maybe you also structure her hours to make drop off and pick up at the daycare accessible, or even

allow her to work from home to be home with her kids.

BOOM! You are now a social business!!!


