From the President

This letter is very different from the one I started to write 2 weeks ago. Since that time, there has been a ban on large gatherings, schools and even public facilities have been ordered closed. I am



also getting daily updates from governing bodies and companies alike outlining their COVID-19 responses.

Vivo has been ordered closed to the

public, and I just received word that casinos and community centers across the province have been ordered closed and the City of Calgary has declared a state of local emergency.

This changes most of our plans for April. Our fundraising casino is now on hold and our (legally required) AGM is going to look very different from previous years. Public hours are cancelled, and other activities are on hold and will be reviewed every two weeks.

Since things are moving very quickly and the newspaper is put together weeks in advance of it being delivered to you, the NHCA will be relying on our website and social media to get news and updates to you in a timely manner. If you are on Facebook or Twitter, please search for @ northernhillscalgary and "like" or follow the page – that will turn on notifications so we can keep you informed of what's happening in your community.

I urge you to get your information from trusted official sources and not fall prey to panic or scams, which inevitably follow these types of emergencies.

I also urge you to remember to be kind. Social distancing makes hugs a bad idea, but do you have a neighbour that lives alone and may be scared? Call them up and ask if they need anything. The NHCA is working with other groups and volunteers in the community to identify

and support seniors and isolated individuals (without risking them, of course!). A simple "Hello! How are you?" can make all the difference in the world to someone who feels isolated, scared, and alone.

In closing, being complacent and panicking are both bad ideas - as in all things, we need to think clearly, act on the best information available, and support each other through this difficult time.

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

Calgary Parks - Spring in the City!



Calgary is home to an abundance of wildlife which make their homes in our parks and natural areas. The arrival of spring is a great reminder of the importance of coexisting with these animals. One way this can be achieved is through maintaining a distance from their young.

Baby hares, deer, and squirrels may appear to be abandoned by their parents, and our help is not usually needed. These wildlife babies are often left alone to keep them safe. Removing wildlife from their natural habitat can decrease their chances of

survival and even compromise your safety.

Wildlife is best enjoyed from a distance and this is especially important for coyotes. Coyotes may become more aggressive if you are near a den and they are protecting their young. Always keep your distance when you spot wildlife to reduce the chance of conflict.

Some tips on living with (and enjoying) Calgary's wildlife:

- Do not feed wildlife.
- Stay on designated City trails and pathways.
- Always keep your pets leashed and under control
- Clean up food and pet waste this reduces wildlife being attracted to the area by the food source. Remember: wild animals are

best enjoyed from a distance and left alone. Contact 311 to report your

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

Increasing the Canada Child Benefit

The Federal Government is providing an extra \$300 per child through the Canada Child Benefit (CCB) for 2019-20. This will mean approximately \$550 more for the average family. Benefit begins in May.

Special Goods and Services Tax credit payment

The Federal Government will provide a one-time special payment by early May through the Goods and Services Tax credit for low- and modest-income families.

The average additional benefit will be close to \$400 for single individuals and close to \$600 for couples.

Federal Employment Insurance (EI) Sickness Benefits for COVID-19

Employment Insurance (EI) sickness benefits provide up to 15 weeks of income replacement and is available to eligible claimants who are unable to work because of illness, injury or quarantine, to allow them time to restore their health and return to work. Canadians quarantined can apply for Employment Insurance (EI) sickness benefits.

If you are eligible, visit www.Canada.ca and search El Sickness Benefits.

Service Canada is ready to support Canadians affected by COVID-19 and placed in quarantine, with the following support actions:

- The one-week waiting period for El sickness benefits will be waived for new claimants
- Applicants will not have to provide a medical certificate



Delayed claims will be accepted and backdated

Submit your claim first, then contact us to have the one-week waiting period waived. Telephone: 1-833-381-2725 (toll-free)

The Canada Emergency Response Benefit

The Government of Canada will provide a taxable benefit of \$2,000 a month for up to 4 months to:

- workers who must stop working due to COVID19 and do not have access to paid leave
- workers who are sick, quarantined, or taking care of someone who is sick with COVID-19
- working parents who must stay home without pay to care for children
- workers who still have their employment but are not being paid because there is currently not sufficient work

• wage earners and self-employed individuals, including contract workers

Application details will be available through My CRA and My Service Canada, beginning the first week of April.

Government of Alberta Emergency Isolation Support

www.alberta.ca/emergency-isolation-support. aspx

- This is a temporary program for working adult Albertans who must self-isolate because they meet the Government of Alberta's published criteria for self-isolation, including persons who are the sole caregiver for a dependent who must self-isolate because they meet the public health criteria, and who will not have another source of pay or compensation during self-isolation.
- A one-time payment of \$1,146 will be distributed to bridge the gap until the Federal Government's emergency payments beginning in April 2020.

Student Loan Payments

The Government of Alberta and the Federal Government have implemented a six-month, interest free moratorium on Student Loan payments:

- Interest will not accrue during this period.
- Students do not need to apply for the repayment pause.
- Borrowers may continue making payments during this period if they choose and this will not affect their eligibility to receive the benefit.

Parent Link Family Services

FUNDING CHANGES ANNOUNCED FOR FAMILY CONNECTIONS PARENT LINK CENTRE AND NORTH CENTRAL FAMILY SUPPORT PROGRAM

We were notified by Alberta Children's Services via letter that the funding process for programs is changing, and funding will not be renewed for the Family Connections Parent Link Centre or the North Central Family Support program as of March 31, 2020.

Future funding decisions will be made by Alberta Children's Services based on responses to expressions of interest that were released November 7.

Huntington Hills staff will be looking closely at the new process to ensure our application is aligned with



the new framework under the new funding model. Our goal is to continue to deliver programs and services for children and families within our community. We are optimistic that programs and services delivered by Huntington Hills Community Association (previously as Family Connections Parent Link and the North Central Family Support Program) align with the provincial framework and hope that we will be successful in our application to become a Family Resource Network.





As a resident of Panorama Hills with an encumbrance to the Northsar Residents Association Ltd. (NSRA), you are automatically a member of the NSRA. Members in good standing are entitled to exclusive access to the Panorama Hills Community Centre and the included amenities.

To become a member in good standing you must pay the mandatory annual Residents Association (RA) fee due each year on or before April 30. The April 2020 - March 2021 fee is due April 30, 2020. Any unpaid fees as of May 1, 2020, will be subject interest charges and ongoing delinquency may result in the property being sent into the collections process.

The 2020-2021 Residents Association (RA) fee remains unchanged from previous years: Single Family Home: 250.00 + GST = 262.50Multi-Family Home: 200.00 + GST = 210.00

Payment reminders are sent out at the end of March but the obligation is on the homeowner to ensure the fee is paid by April 30 each year. Northridge Feedermain Construction Traffic Delays

You will have noted construction activity in our ward last year because of the upgrade to our water main, designed to improve capacity and reliability of the drinking water supply. In early April 2020, construction will begin for the next phase of the project. We have compiled a list of the anticipated traffic impacts within the ward:

- From April to Fall 2020, the City will be completing open trench excavation work along Harvest Hills Blvd
- There will be rolling lane closures on southbound Harvest Hills Blvd from the Stoney Trail Overpass to Panamount Boulevard NW. Northbound lanes will accommodate two-way traffic.
- Traffic detours will be divided into six sections. No more than two sections will be closed at any time. Construction will move north to the next section as work is completed.
- From late March to May 2020, the City will be completing the last 20 meters of feedermain

installation on 14 Street NW, north of Symons Valley Parkway NW:

There will be a single-lane closure on northbound 14 Street NW, north of Symons Valley Parkway NW


There are many important issues that Parliament is currently seized with. I appreciate hearing from constituents on areas of policy concern and interest regularly.


Plant Exchange





Waste and Recycling Update

· Green cart collection will remain at every other week (instead of switching to weekly collection in April). No extra bags of yard waste will be picked up starting March 24, 2020.



- Black carts are collected every other week. No extra bags of garbage will be picked up starting March 24, 2020.
- Blue carts are collected every week.

City landfills (Shepard, East Calgary and Spyhill) will stay on the six-day schedule, however only credit and debit cards are now accepted for payment.

Bicycle Helmet Emergency Safety



Head injuries are the leading cause of serious injury and death to kids on wheels*. Most injuries occur when a cyclist suffers a fall, strikes a stationary object, or collides with another cyclist/pedestrian. Remember - it's the law in Alberta that cyclists under the age of 18 must wear a helmet (and highly recommended for all ages). Helmets should be CSA approved and worn during recreational activities such as skateboarding, in-line skating, and cycling.

Getting informed

- Wearing a helmet while cycling can prevent a serious injury, or even save a life;
- Brain injuries can cause permanent disability or death;
- Reduce your risk by always wearing your helmet;
- Replace any helmet that has been involved in a crash, even if it appears undamaged.

Getting started

- Allow children to assist when ٠ buying their helmet. Cyclists who choose their own helmet are more likely to wear them;
- Start the habit early. Young children learning to ride tricycles need to wear helmets;
- Parents must lead by example always wear a helmet when cycling.

Getting the right fit

- Take the time to properly fit and adjust your helmet to ensure maximum protection in case of a crash;
- When worn properly, helmets should fit level, not tilted up, or down over the forehead;
- Helmets should feel snug, but not too tight. To test the fit, the helmet should not fall off when you shake your head from side-to-side while the
 - straps are unfastened; Adjust the chin straps to form a "Y" below and slightly forward from the ears;
 - Only one finger should be able to fit under the chin strap when it is fastened;
- Do not forget to use the sizing pads included with the helmet. They will help improve the overall fit, comfort and safety.
