The original Order caused unintentional permit delays and affected appeal deadlines for development permit and subdivision applications, as well as unintentionally delayed construction of those developments.</i></p> <p><i>The new order has ‘reset the clock’ on appeal periods for any development permits and subdivision applications that had an appeal period running at any point between March 25 and April 17, effectively restarting the appeal period on April 17.</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Moving forward, all development permits and subdivision applications, which were originally advertised between March 5 and April 16, will be subject to an additional 21 day appeal period. This additional appeal time began on April 17.</i> • <i>Any development permits or subdivision applications which have not yet be advertised can now proceed to advertisement and will be subject to the standard 21 day appeal period.</i>

This is for the PlayHub located on Coventry Drive (& Covington Close) in conjunction with Vivo.</p> <p>If confident with the agreement, please sign and scan back to me – I will also come pick up the hard copy. An electronic copy will be used by Law at this time to execute the document, however when things get back to ‘normal’ the original signed hard copy will be executed, and copies distributed back to the NHCA for your records.</p> <p>MOTION to enter into the agreement has already been made.</p>
Good Food Box	<p>WE are looking for a location for a Good Food Box in Ward 3. If you know of any location which may work, please let me know. We will ensure that location is deemed essential service and able to open doors only to facilitate that program.</p>
Country Hills Estates Planter Boxes – Optional Amenities Agreement (OAA)	<p>The NHCA has been approached to see if you are willing to sign an OAA for planter boxes in the entrance into Country Hills Estates.</p> <p>This would be a five-year agreement with very little risk to the NHCA. The group in Country Hills Estates would be responsible for planting and maintaining, Parks will deliver the planters. If the planters do not get planted, they would just sit empty.</p> <p>The largest risk for the NHCA would be at the end of the 5 years if they planters were not longer needed, NHCA may have to pay to have them removed. Parks may be able to assist if that happens, but we cannot guarantee at this time.</p> <p>MOTION REQUIRED if not already done so?</p>

<p>Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy</p>	<p>The Federation of Calgary Communities received some details about the 75% wage subsidy. Unfortunately, the details for non-profits might still be in the works for those not quite meeting the 30% revenue loss definition (all community associations would but some other members might not). There will also be a 3-6-week delay to operationalize the subsidy and there will be a high level of accountability placed on it, with real consequences if not utilized correctly.</p> <p>https://www.canada.ca/en/department-finance/news/2020/04/the-canada-emergency-wage-subsidy.html</p> <p>Subsidy particulars:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Entity demonstrates a 30% decline in “gross” revenues (they are still working out the details for non-profits that define revenues differently) - Up to 75% of salary up to \$58,700 per employee or \$847 per week per employee - Retroactive to March 15, 2020 - 3 months to June 6, 2020 - They are developing the “application” process likely through My CRA portal (3 to 6 weeks out) – payments (direct deposits to entity) will take a few weeks after approval - Employer will have to attest to everything and that they can pay the remaining 25% to employees - Need to re-apply every month - Consequence (fines and jail time) for making false claims <p>Finally, for those organizations that do not qualify for the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy may qualify for the previously announced wage subsidy of 10 per cent of remuneration paid from March 18 to before June 20, up to a maximum subsidy of \$1,375 per employee and \$25,000 per employer.</p>

They have offered to project manage the winter water installation to turnkey status, so I gladly took them up on it!</i> <i>Prairie Sage has sent in their estimate for the raised seating beds, and they are within budget. Construction on these, and the sunflower bed, can begin once I have approval from Parks.</i> <i>Until the COVID-19 gathering restrictions are fully lifted, we can't reasonably hold the opening event, and wouldn't want to put anyone at risk by doing so. So, this is on indefinite hold until external forces change.</i></p> <p>Project #2: Five SE Coventry Parks <i>Matt and Valerie at O2 are going through the wish boards and engagement files I sent over and we're setting up a virtual meeting where I can use my phone video to take them on a tour of the two parks they will be designing for us (see background info document attached that I sent to them). Once the designs are created, we will email them to the board and post to the Creating Coventry Facebook page for the community to see and comment on.</i></p> <p>Project #5: Dog Park <i>The meeting I was going to have with our MLA, Minister Sawhney, re: gaining permission for access to the land from the Province has been rescheduled several times since January. With the Minister now dealing with the pandemic, I don't have a rescheduled date yet. Until we get this figured out, I can't proceed further with this project.</i></p> <p>Project #6: Coventry Pollinator Corridor <i>With spring finally upon us, we're going to need to work with Calgary Parks (Alan Joiner from the City and their Environmental Education team) to identify weeds and remove them, and start watering again. We may need to reseed, but that will be determined by Parks. Once I know more and we find out about how the COVID-19 restrictions may apply, I'll get in touch with Yana re: volunteers to help.</i></p> <p>Everything else... <i>Everything else is on hold right now, including the community engagement re: Coventry's parks prioritization, until we know more about how the pandemic will restrict our actions over this coming summer.</i></p>
<p>Harvest Hills Hub</p> <p><i>Communication from email</i></p>	<p><i>We are required by the City to postpone / cancel all events until June 30th, which means our Parade of Garage Sales, Plant Exchange, Neighbour Day Celebration, and Dog Adoption Day have been affected. Also, the first month of our weekly classes (yoga and hoop) have been cancelled. We are still planning on hosting events / classes if and when sanctions are removed. Following July 1st we have a Maker's Market, Bike/Wheelchair Parade, Book Swap, and Halloween Festival planned as well as the remaining hula hoop and yoga classes.
