
The NHCA is very pleased to be working with the MPC in supporting our seniors, and I'm very proud of them for winning this award.



Yielding to Emergency Vehicles



For everyone's safety, it is important motorists understand how to correctly yield right-ofway to emergency vehicles with their lights and sirens activated. You can help EMS, police, and fire get to the scene quickly and safely by following these rules of the road.

When an emergency vehicle approaches with lights and siren activated:

- If you're in the middle of an intersection when an emergency vehicle approaches with lights and siren activated, safely clear the intersection;
- On a one or two lane road, motorists should move to the right side of the road, slow down, and then stop, remaining parallel with the road. Remember to signal;
- Move right or left to the nearest curb on one-way streets;
- On a road with three or more lanes, motorists should move to the nearest side of the road and stop. If driving in the centre lane, move to the right side of the road and stop. Remember to signal;
- Come to a complete stop and wait for the emergency vehicle to pass. Shoulder check for more emergency vehicles before reentering traffic flow. Remember to signal;
- Emergency vehicles might use any available road space to maneuver. This could include shoulders or turning lanes, etc., in order to pass other traffic.

When operating a vehicle:

- Motorists must reduce speed to 60 km/h or the posted speed, whichever is lower, when passing emergency vehicles or tow trucks that are stopped with their lights flashing. This law applies to the lane(s) immediately next to the stopped vehicles. If you're not in the lane next to the stopped vehicles, it is recommended to reduce speed and leave lots of space between yourself and emergency personnel.
- Do not break the rules of the road in order to give right of way to an emergency vehicle. This could include proceeding through a red light, or making an illegal turn. Actions such as these jeopardize all motorists in the area;
- Drivers must place their full attention on the roadway and toward the safe operation of their vehicle at all times. The fine for distracted driving in Alberta is \$300.00 and three demerit points;
- Do not drive within 150 meters of an emergency vehicle with its siren and/or flashing lights on. For reference, 150 m is nearly 1.5 times the length of a football field





Community Means Common Unity

I participated in a murder mystery birthday party and played the role of a Russian rocket scientist who had defected to America in 1959. After receiving five

minutes of extensive training via YouTube, I dressed like a nerdy scientist and spoke with a pitiful Russian accent. Some others at the party – including my own family – were surprised at my goofy, silly side. I come across as rather laid-back and easy-going, but I am competitive and strong-willed.

Have you ever seen a different side of someone you didn't know was there? How did this help you come to know them better and appreciate them more?

Building a strong, healthy, fulfilling relationship with someone requires a foundation of knowing, loving and accepting them for who they are and not for what you wish they would be. Imagine how you would feel if people treated you a certain way based on what they heard about you rather than your *own* words and actions.

Let's avoid sowing division among people. I picture someone sneaking into a beautiful garden at night and scattering "weed seeds" that he brought from his yard. These seeds are tiny and unnoticeable at first but eventually overrun the garden. To "divide and conquer" is an ancient strategy. In contrast, the Greek poet Homer observed more than 2,500 years ago, "There is a strength in the union even of very sorry men."

Families, communities and nations can make significant progress when we focus on what we have in common! Division amongst us has reached pandemic proportions, so it's time for more listening and respectful dialogue. Before we brush off the relevance of this discussion and shrug our shoulders because we can't do anything about division "out there," let's ask ourselves about *our* relationships and webs of influence. Could our preconceived ideas and comments about others be hindering relationships and partnerships? What do we do and say to promote unity?

Let's build community through common unity.

2 cups of glutinous rice flour

1 tablespoon baking powder

3 eggs

1/₃ cups of sugar

½ cups of oil

½ cups of milk

Two cups= 500 ml 1 tablespoon=5ml

Preheat oven to 375 Fahrenheit

Pour the batter into the silicone muffin pan

Bake for 25 minutes

It is said that if using a silicone muffin pan when baking muffins that muffins won't stick. Very simple tip! It's up to yourself to add more of your favourite ingredients (evaporated milk, fruits and nuts)

We are also looking to expand our Volunteer Relations Team! We are looking to fill the following roles on this committee:


Events Volunteer Coordinator





