It was determined that Alberta’s population grew enough to add 3 seats, one of them in Calgary.</p> <p>Background information and possible impact of issue and/or area: The NHCA opposed the boundary changes 10 years ago when Calgary Skyview was created arguing that it did not follow the legislation requiring that they try to work within existing community, municipal, provincial and geographical/physical boundaries. We also mentioned the inability to get an MP to cross Deerfoot Trail. Not much has changed in 10 years and 4 MP’s later. The proposed changes will group Coventry Hills and PART of Panorama Hills together, with the remainder of Panorama Hills, Country Hills, and Harvest Hills in Calgary Nose Hill.</p> <p>Recommendation for board action, if any.
