

## Pathway laws and etiquette

Share the pathway and share the responsibilities. Those who use the pathway get along better when they show courtesy and consideration for others. Calgary's parks and pathways are regulated by the Parks and Pathways Bylaw 20M2003. This excerpt provides an overview of pathway laws and suggested pathway etiquette, but please refer to the bylaw for more detailed information.

## (\*) indicates a legal requirement.



## Be visible

- Wear light-toned clothing with reflective tape material.
- Outfit your bicycle with a white front light, red rear reflector and a red rear light. \*



## Signal when passing

- Use your voice, bell or horn to inform others that you are passing. \*
- Those being passed should acknowledge with a wave.



## Keep to the right

- All pathway users must keep to the right half of the pathway except when passing. \*
- Move off the pathway to the right when stopping.
- Cyclists should ride single file.

Our closest shopping mall is outside city limits. You might not run into your neighbours at a nearby restaurant because they went to Airdrie, or Beacon Hill, or somewhere else. Everyone is busy. Everyone wants someone else to take on their battles. We can't even get 50% of our community to vote. And less than 10% buy a community membership. I am taking an active role in making things better, which I think is better than complaining about it and not doing anything. I thank all the other people that volunteer to make our community, a community. You are all heroes.

## COMMUNITY PLAYGROUNDS UPDATE May 2017 Update

### **HARVEST GLEN WAY PLAYGROUND**

After many months of research and visioning, the Harvest Playground Committee, spearheaded by Meghan and Victoria, has been brought to life in the form of a conceptual drawing by IBI Group, thanks to a grant from the Parks Foundation Calgary. The grand unveiling was at the NHCA's AGM on Thursday, April 13th, at Harvest Hills Alliance Church, and we have since revealed the designs on our Facebook Page (facebook.com/northernhillscalgary/).

The design encompasses not only some more challenging playground equipment so it appeals to kids of all ages, but it ties into the themes of "nature" and "motion" that the Committee based the design concept on. An artificial "tree" climbing frame, spinners, a hill slide and more will tie in to the beautifully designed Alberta Nature Discovery Trail that will wind around the site. Each "pod" will contain different native Alberta plant species (and possibly a giant insect or animal!) with an informative marker to educate visitors about the plants and animals they can find at the park. The species chosen are drought tolerant, being native to Alberta, as will be the grasses that have to be replanted, so that this is not only a much more user-friendly community outdoor hub, but better for our environment and water-wise as well. Our MLA's office is donating some of the plants towards this project.

In addition, this space has been designed to be a community gathering space - somewhere for families and community groups to come and enjoy a picnic, a chat or even a small, informal event. Picnic tables and benches are being designed and built by the shop teachers and students at Notre Dame High School, to make this a real community led project and something we can all be proud of!

## THE HARD WORK BEGINS NOW

Now for the hard part - the fundraising to build this beautiful vision. At the time of writing, the Harvest Playground Committee has been putting together a fundraising plan. We are working with a candy company to offer treats that donate back profits to this playground and outdoor community hub project. The committee will be out at community events with order forms and dropping flyers off in the community. If you receive one, please consider helping us to make this vision a reality

## Green Cart service is coming to your home

As the Green Cart program rolls out this year, you'll see how you can cut your garbage in half

and turn your food and yard material into valuable nutrient-rich compost. Here's what homeowners can expect from the program.

You'll receive everything you need to get started When your green cart arrives look inside to find:

- Kitchen pail and samples of compostable bags to collect food scraps
- Samples of paper yard waste bags to use when your cart is full
- Instruction guide
- Collection schedule

### You'll be amazed at how much can go in

All food and yard waste can go in the green cart. You can even put in things that you can't compost at home like meat, bones, cheese, bread, pasta, branches and pet waste too.

These materials can be safely composted because the material reaches and maintains a temperature of at least 55 degrees Celsius during the composting process, which kills any harmful bacteria.

### Green carts will be rolled out by quadrant

Once everyone in your quadrant receives their carts, weekly green cart pick up will begin and garbage collection will move to once every two weeks.

Once the community rollout schedule is finalized it will be available on calgary.ca/greencart.

### Live in an apartment or condo?

By Nov. 1, 2017 your building is required to separate food and yard waste from the garbage for composting or diversion. Talk to your building owner or manager or visit calgary.ca/multifamily.

## Outdoor home improvement project on your mind?

Planning on building a garage, expanding your deck or maybe installing a hot tub? You might be wondering: What permits do I require? How long it will take? Or what bylaw and code considerations do I need to know about?

Before you pay for materials, hire a contractor or do it yourself, let The City help guide you on permitting and inspection requirements. We know the process can be confusing but we're here to help answer your questions to ensure your project meets Alberta's safety codes and city bylaws.

At this event residents will also be given the chance to voice their ongoing concerns.

As a 21 year veteran of the Calgary Police Service, traffic safety is of paramount concern to me. This issue also consistently appears as a top concern in citizen satisfaction surveys so I also know it is of great importance to you. That is why the Traffic Safety meeting is open to all Ward 4 residents and will be a forum that fosters discussion, raises awareness, and leads to real solutions.

CPS who utilizes both education and enforcement to ensure the safety of drivers and pedestrians, rely heavily on traffic safety requests, as a key indicator of where targeted enforcement and education are needed, to address traffic concerns. So, based on your

feedback at this meeting, CPS will be able to conduct additional enforcement in our Ward and report-back their findings. The City's Transportation Department will then be able to research and recommend specific engineering measures that could be applied where other issues persist.

Greetings Residents of Calgary Northern Hills,

As spring arrives in Alberta, our economy is stabilizing and jobs are beginning to return. We are starting to see renewed investment in drilling and the oil sands. We are seeing new investment in value-added energy projects and in green energy projects.

The Alberta government announced its Budget 2017 on March 16. This budget demonstrated a commitment to making life affordable for everyday Albertans, and keep taxes on families the lowest in Canada. School and bussing fees are to be reduced. Post-secondary tuition fees will be capped. More apprenticeships and training opportunities will be funded.

This government has also cut the growth of government spending. Waste, perks and excessive salaries have been reined in. Salaries for non-unionized public sector workers, along with salaries for those serving on agencies, boards and commissions, have been frozen. A collaborative new agreement with doctors will save Albertan taxpayers \$500 million over two years.

At the same time, investment in modernizations of our schools, hospitals, roads and highways are long overdue. Much-needed repairs and upgrades will keep Albertans working while making life better for Albertans who need those services.

Of special interest to Calgary-Northern Hills constituents, Alberta's Budget 2017 allocates \$500 million towards 26 school projects across Alberta, both new builds and modernization projects.

### Coventry Hills/Country Hills Village Elementary School

On March 26, I had the opportunity to attend a school announcement at Forest Lawn High School with Minister of Finance Joe Ceci and many representatives from the Calgary Board of Education (CBE). That high school received modernization funding and three new elementary schools were announced, including one right here in Coventry Hills.

The Coventry Hills/Country Hills Village Elementary School has ranked in top positions on the CBE Three-Year School Capital Plan for several consecutive years. Currently, 996 Kindergarten to Grade 4 students reside in the Coventry Hills and Country Hills Village neighbourhoods, with another 1,696 preschool-aged children quickly approaching school age. Funding announced for a new school should lead to smaller class sizes for our youngest learners, in other area schools as well - such as Coventry Hills School and Nose Creek School.

## **North Calgary High School**

Even as we celebrated the announcement of a new elementary school, many in our community point out that the long wait continues for the North Calgary High School. The school site is the vacant land beside the intersection of Panatella Gate NW, and Harvest Hills Blvd N, and just across Coventry Hills Way NE from Nose Creek School.

Thank you to those who have demonstrated support for this new high school through e-mails, phone calls and rallies, working with myself, and our local CBE trustee to move this school up the list of priorities in the CBE's Three-Year School Capital Plan 2018-2021. The North Calgary High School is currently ranked in 8th position in the Year 1 list of CBE's "Capital Priorities – New School Construction." I will continue speaking with Minister of Education David Eggen and with CBE so that our community gets the school infrastructure we need.

### **Report to Constituents** - May 2017

As you know, my top priority remains the Alberta econOn March 22nd, the federal government released its budget for 2017.

Many of you have contacted me expressing concern over the level of federal spending, the deficit, and the lack of a plan to return to balanced budgets in the foreseeable future. Unfortunately, the latest federal budget does not do anything to alleviate your concerns. In fact, the projected deficit for 2017 is \$23 billion and, at this current rate of spending, the budget will not be balanced until 2050.

Statistics released from the Parliamentary Budget Officer's (PBO) 2016 Labour Market Assessment show that despite the massive deficit spending the federal government has undertaken, between Q3 2015 and Q3 2016 there were no net full time jobs created. For those of you who are unaware of the role of the PBO, they provide non-partisan, independent, and armslength fiscal and economic analysis of government activity.

Of further concern is the fact that the government's own Gross Domestic Product projections continue to decline despite the increased deficit spending. Canadians are right to be questioning

the logic of huge deficits, with no end in sight, which are not creating jobs and are not increasing Canada's competitiveness economically or creating future growth. This is not to mention the scrapping of tax credits, including the public transit tax credit, and delays for investments in critical job training programs, infrastructure, defence, and child care.

I will continue to fight for the interests of Alberta families, workers and seniors who are being impacted by this economic downturn.

I recently sponsored petition e-983 which is currently open for signature. The petition is in response to the government's discussion paper regarding changes to the way the House of Commons operates. These proposed changes would eliminate Friday sittings in Parliament, set permanent limits to debate in the House of Commons and committees, and only require the Prime Minister to attend Question Period once per week.

I believe these proposed changes are not in the best interest of Canadians. If you agree I would ask you to visit my website, www.MichelleRempel.ca and sign the petition today.
