We had hoped this year's Community Q&A was the ideal opportunity for the many, many residents who are asking for a public high school on social media to have voiced their request directly to the CBE or our MLA's office, as they were both represented at our AGM.

At the end of March we asked the question on Facebook, "What would you say are the greatest needs in the community?". To date it has reached 1,941

people and there have been all kinds of answers, ranging from a public high school (currently top of the list), a health centre and a community centre (tied at second place), pedestrian crossing lights, LRT, off leash dog parks, leisure spaces (such as an outdoor rink with boards, more indoor ice, an indoor roller rink and indoor soccer pitches), to more neighbourly activities, protected park space, paved pathways, and much, much more.







community residents on various Facebook groups, to see neighbours helping neighbours, to see residents organising their own clean up, and we were happy to hear at our AGM from the community members in Coventry who have stepped up to create safer neighbourhoods, with CPS (see the Blockwatch article below). This really is awesome. However, we are still going to ask you for more.

We know we have asked this many times over the years, but with all the things our community still wants and needs, and at a time when a major residential development is being considered on the Harvest Hills golf course that could add thousands more people to the community, with tens of

thousands more due to move into the new, residential developments north of Stoney Trail, we want you to STEP UP, SPEAK UP, and SIGN UP (as an NHCA member). Please contact your Councillor, your MLA and your MP and let them know that the residents of North Central Calgary are important, too. Let them know why you need the health centre, the high school, the LRT, and the VIVO expansion; or why you don't want dense, residential development on the Harvest Hills golf course. Don't know where to send a letter? No problem! Their contact details are in this newsletter. For traffic and bylaw issues you can even let them know through the City of Calgary 311 app...

Be that squeaky wheel. Let them know: it's OUR TURN.

Blockwatch

Crime is something we are all becoming more aware of in Northern Hills. It may appear like crime is increasing, but as crime is reported in more digital and social media, we are becoming more aware. Crime for the first two months of 2016 in the Northern Hills is actually down compared to the first two months of 2015.

Primarily, the thefts that are occurring are due to unlocked vehicles, unlocked house doors, open windows and unlocked fence gates. The majority of crimes that occur in our community are preventable.

What can you do to protect your family and yourself? As a community, we are safer if we are watching out for each other. Get to know your neighbours. Get their telephone numbers and give yours out so they can alert you to criminal activity. You can download this useful neighbour card to keep the information readily available: https://calgarycommunities.com/content/wp-content/uploads/2015/06/My-Neighbour-Card.pdf or pick up a printed card from outside the Northern Hills Community Association office at VIVO.

You can also start a Blockwatch community by creating a text chat with everyone's cell phone numbers so you can all communicate if there is suspicious criminal activity in your community. Whats App™ is a good text chat application that can be used on multiple mobile platforms, and there are multiple Coventry Hills Blockwatch groups successfully using this app. You can also create a Facebook group site so all the neighbours in your area can keep aware of what is occurring.

In Coville, a neighbourhood within Coventry Hills, where a block watch has been running for 6 months, they have seen crime go down from 14 criminal events (car prowling, car theft, residential B&E) in a month to 1 criminal event per month or in some months no event. This has been achieved by all the citizens in the neighbourhood getting to know the neighbours around them, and watching out for each other. They have also become aware of existing criminal activity through the Coville Facebook Block Watch site and they have been securing their valuables (car doors, house doors, fence gates). There are video camera systems that immediately inform citizens of criminal activity via motion detection, and alerts are sent to cell phones so CPS can be immediately informed. Watch members are actively patrolling the area at all times of the day and night to inform CPS of criminal activity. These groups are sending all video, photos of

footprints and any criminal evidence to Steve Kelly #3216, our local CPS Community Resource Officer.

For Coventry Hills residents, there is a useful crime awareness Facebook site that has been created to keep everyone informed: https://www.facebook.com/groups/CHWatchdogs/. We suggest all community members in Coventry Hills join this site to become aware of criminal activity. We also recommend to other neighbourhoods within Northern Hills to create something similar and share what you are seeing. If you go into the Files section on the Watchdog site, you will find Facebook Block Watch pages created for every area of Coventry Hills.

Valuable Information can be found on the Northern Hills Community Association website http://www.northernhills.ab.ca/blockwatch/ which we will try to keep up to date. Report all suspicious activities. If a vehicle or person appears out of place, please go with your instincts and call the police. Non-Emergency (403)266-1234. Emergency 911. It is very important to contact CPS before posting or texting with other community members on suspicious criminal activity. You may think that the footprints and video you have shared with your community Facebook group is not important, but this can mean catching a criminal. 



Update from CFRD

As I write this article we have a letter writing campaign underway that has gone well, with the City of Calgary again getting the message that the residents of Northern Hills and the Golf community city-wide do not support this proposed development. A huge thank you to everyone who wrote letters in opposition to this ill-conceived development.

As it sits today, the City has done another Detailed Team Review (DTR) which again asks QuantumPlace Development Inc. (QPD) to make some significant changes to the plan to reduce density. The City and Municipal Development Plan (MDP) recommend:

8 units per acre. QPD has 10.7 units per acre in their second amended plan.

- the removal of the cul-de-sacs on holes 3 & 4 of the course
- increase rail safety measures
- provide more green space with amenities
- resolve property boundary issues
- resolution of conservation issues such as storm water management and tree retention.

QPD has not dealt with these issues to the satisfaction of the City of Calgary Planning department and residents of Harvest hills in their first two submissions. Perhaps we will see a significant change in their third submission. QPD is hoping to present to the Calgary Planning Commission in May and then to City Council for final approval in July. This is exceedingly optimistic so we can only speculate as to why Cedarglen Homes has decided to not open Harvest Hills Golf Course

this season.

From the perspective of the Calgarians for Responsible Development (CFRD) we are focusing on stopping this development. But we want to make sure that the proposal adheres to the spirit of the MDP. This plan defines City Council's vision for the future of Calgary. In order for the City to achieve the vision, they need to make sure that all developments contribute positively to the MDP. We do not believe this proposed development is of any benefit to our community and we do not believe that it meets the core goals of the city's Municipal Development Plan nor the Calgary Transportation Plan. The proposed development would need to:

- Contribute to the local economy,
- Add density as prescribed by the city 8 units per acre and not 10.7 units per acre as submitted by QPD. High density is also to be provided within a 10 minute walk of a major transit corridor such as the Green Line, which, realistically, is several years away.

- Create great communities where the new development is to create a better more complete community for existing and future residents.
- Make Calgary a livable, attractive, memorable and functional city.
- Conserve, protect and restore the natural environment

We believe it will not make Calgary a livable, attractive, memorable and functional city; in fact it will detract from the City of Calgary as a whole.

CFRD has done a detailed analysis of the proposed development vs. The MDP (the full report is available on our website, http://www.calgarians4rd. com/). The second submission rates ,at best (and this is generous), a "D" grade because the outline plan focuses on increasing density without providing other amenities, has significant safety risks due to its proximity to the railway and is not supported by a major transit corridor. If City Council is serious about achieving the vision in the MDP, our goal is that they recommend against approval of this proposed land use designation.


How safe is your backyard

Backyard fire pits are great places to gather and share good times in Calgary's summer months, but these great times can quickly become tragic if you aren't safe.

The City of Calgary has bylaw standards to help minimize some of the dangers of your backyard fire pit, or outdoor fireplace, wood burning oven or chimneys. The Calgary Fire Department also has a number of tips to help prevent anyone from getting hurt.

Safety tips and bylaw regulations

- Backyard fire pits should be built into the ground, on brick or stone, or in a fire-resistant container.
- Portable fire pits may be used on a deck as long as they sit on brick or stone, and not directly on your wooden deck.
- Fire pits must be at least two metres away



from your property line, house, garage, or fence.

- Fire pits must not be under any trees, branches, plants or other materials that can catch fire.
- Always have a way to put out the fire close to your fire pit. Easy options are your watering hose or a bucket of water.
- All fires in your fire pit must be kept to a reasonable size; under 1 metre high and wide. This helps ensure the fire's embers, sparks or smoke do not harm anyone or cause a nuisance to neighbouring properties.

- All fires in your fire pit must be continually supervised.
- Fires may only be burned in fire pits from 10 a.m. to 1 a.m., unless prohibited in a fire
- Do not burn:
 - Painted, treated or lumber containing glue or resin
 - Wet, or green/fresh cut wood
 - Yard waste (cut grass or leaves)
 - Garbage
 - Rubber
 - Plastic
 - **Furniture**

Always check www.calgary.ca/firebans to ensure no fire bans are in effect, which may caution against or forbid using fire pits. Remember, you can be fined from \$500 to \$5,000 for not following Calgary's fire pit bylaws (5M2004) or the instructions of fire bans. Learn more about Calgary fire pit safety and Bylaws by visiting calgary.ca and searching the term 'fire pits'.

Planters are NOT Ashtrays!

A May Safety Tip from your Calgary Fire Department

Today's potting soils contain large volumes of peat moss. When peat moss gets too dry, it becomes highly flammable. On top of that, you'll often find shredded wood, bark, Styrofoam, vermiculite, and fertilizer in potting mix. Like peat moss, all of these ingredients ignite easily under dry conditions.

Over the past number of years we have received numerous 911 calls from citizens who have witnessed potting soil fires on the exterior of homes. These fires are typically attributed the careless disposal of smoking materials. If any of your friends or family smoke, ensure that you have an appropriate, non-combustible

container to place the cigarette butt in. Cigarette butts that have been disposed of in a planter can smoulder for hours and may cause a fire when you least expect it...possibly when you're

A few simple precautions will help to keep your home safe:

- Do not butt out cigarettes in any potted planters
- Make sure smokers have a safe place to dispose of their butts, indoors and outdoors, so they aren't tempted to use your pot of geraniums instead.
- Keep potting soil and pot-

ted plants away from other combustible materials such as firewood, stacks of old newspapers, aerosols, paint solvents, gasoline and cleaning products.

 Make sure the soil around your potted plants stays moist. Keep in mind that the soil in pots dries out more quickly than soil in garden beds, so plan on more frequent watering.

Did you know? Our engines carry 550 gallons of water for immediate fire attack, as well as 30 gallons of foam for flammable liquid fires.




