

ELECTION TIME IN NORTHERN HILLS

In case you missed it, Canadians go to the polls on October 19th to elect a new government. For the residents of Panorama Hills and Country Hills, you will be electing a Minister of Parliament in Calgary Nose Hill. For the residents of Harvest Hills, Country Hills Village and Coventry Hills, you will elect an MP in the new Calgary Skyview district. The Northern Hills Community Association submitted a proposal for boundary changes and unfortunately it was not supported by the commission. The result is that Coventry Hills, Country Hills Village and Harvest Hills continue to be aligned with communities well east of Deerfoot Trail, so it is highly unlikely we will see a similar forum supported for Calgary Skyview within our community this election.

As pictured above, only days before the election, the current government made exciting announcements that directly impact the residents of the Northern Hills. First, was a \$1.53 billion commitment towards the

long awaited GreenLine LRT, but still requiring the commitment of both Calgary City Council and the Alberta Government. This was an important announcement for the NHCA as we are active members of the LRT on the Green Foundation, an advocacy group working with politicians and business partners to make the LRT a reality in our community. The second announcement was \$500,000 towards Vivo upgrades.

Were these well timed preelection announcements? Of course they were, to the point that we had to consider whether we should even mention them or publish the picture. However, are they infrastructure projects that the Northern Hills and North Central Calgary desperately need? Of course, they are. The announcements brought more attention to the Northern Hills than it seems any politician has done in a long, long time. As an association, our hope is that no matter who is elected, the government will support these projects and that the City and provincial government

will provide funding as appropriate for these projects to be completed.

In an effort to give all candidates the opportunity to share their vision for the Northern Hills and North Central Calgary, we have joined with other North Central Calgary community associations and are pleased to invite all of you to an election forum at 6:30 PM on Friday, September 11th at the Huntington Hills Community

Centre. (Note: Please regularly check the NHCA website for any changes to the forum schedule or venue).

This forum will be of most importance for those residents in Panorama Hills and Country Hills, but also gives all our residents the opportunity to learn more about party platforms, even if it is not the candidate for your district.

Let Our Needs Be Heard

The NHCA loves our community. There is more to this community than people realize but we are not as vocal as other parts of Calgary, and we lose out on infrastructure as a result.

Due to natural barriers, and how road infrastructure was developed, sometimes the Northern Hills seems like an island: The Nose Creek escarpment, which was carved out by glaciers and we understand more recently, served as the original wagon trail between Calgary and Edmonton, provides our east boundary. Sadly, rather than preserve this area for its historic value as a park, the City plans on building roads, warehouses and light industrial through it, even though the Calgary North Area Structure Plan reveals an archaeological site. To the south, Beddington Creek and West Nose Creek run through the south side of the future Aurora business park providing a beautiful pathway system underneath the flightpath for runway 11/29. The west is bordered by West Nose Creek and what was long

ago, the John A. Lewis Rock Quarry. In addition to the natural boundaries, we are isolated inside a triangle comprised of Deerfoot Trail, Stoney Trail, and Beddington Trail, with the Centre Street vehicle trap preventing a natural connection to the south.

Mega-complexes like Crowfoot, Westhills, South Trail Crossing and Shawnessy Centre were built while those neighbourhoods developed, but nothing similar was built in North Central Calgary. We must hop in our cars or take long transit rides to get the essentials other parts of Calgary have. We do not have the LRT, yet, and we fill the 301 faster than they can service us....busier even than the West LRT. Some days, the lack of mega-complexes is a good thing, until you are reminded of the downfall waiting in a 30-minute line at a local restaurant. But we certainly have our share of fast food restaurants.

Four teams of teenage boys from our community commute all the way to Confederation Park for a home

HELP STOP THE REZONING OF HARVEST HILLS GOLF COURSE!

Fellow community members,

As many of you know, the Harvest Hills Golf Course has been sold to a developer, who plans on adding as many dense residential units as they can on the land. THIS IS NOT A DONE DEAL!

The time has finally arrived where you may voice your opposition to the City of Calgary! WE NEED YOUR HELP! You have until SEPTEMBER 24TH, 2015 to do so! Many have asked, "How can I help? What could I possibly do to stop this thing?" Listed below are all the things you can do, and we ask that you try to do as many of them as possible! Our power is in numbers, and we need to demonstrate that this will NOT benefit anyone living in any of the Northern Hills communities.

Reasons why the addition of 692 NEW residential units (which will add well over 2,000 new residents to the area) will not be beneficial, include:

- Increased traffic, especially with the creation of additional intersections to allow new residents onto Country Hills BLVD (likely opposite the most easterly exit from Coventry Hills) during peak times.
- Strain on our medical facilities, as we still do not have an Emergency Clinic, and we have a limited number of clinics and doctors in the area.
- Our schooling system is already at capacity, and many students are already bussed out of the community.
- Loss of and additional strain on recreational assets; Vivo is already beyond capacity.
- Impact on transit: people are already not able to park and ride transit to work, nor get on buses in their existing communities.
- Loss of the most dense collection of mature trees in the NE/North Central area of Calgary.

There are many other reasons to oppose this development which is why we ask for your help in emphasizing the above reasons PLUS your personal reasons for opposition!

So what can YOU do to help?

1) THE FIRST AND MOST IMPORTANT IS SENDING IN AN INDIVIDUALIZED LETTER OF OPPOSITION!

If you have not done so, please do this important step! We have template letters ready to go, to which you can add your individual concerns. These letters have the proper format and information needed to be logged as an official letter of opposition by the city. Please go to www.calgarians4rd.com and click "download letter" to see the template versions. Our preference is to pick up the signed letters from you so that we can drop piles of letters off to the City regularly, but there is information on the website on other methods of getting a letter to the City. You can also drop off your letter to the Northern Hills Community Association (located at VIVO) for collection, if you prefer!

Group letters do not have the same impact, but we welcome these types of letters if that is what people are more comfortable with! Please ONLY sign one letter, not both an Individual and Group Letter. Our preference is for the individual letters. **We will be holding a letter pick up and signing tent on Saturday, September 12th from 10am – 5pm** just outside the Harvest Hills Global Liquor Store (Thanks to Global Liquor for the space).

2) FORWARD OFF THE TEMPLATE LETTERS TO ALL YOUR FRIENDS, FAMILY, AND CO-WORKERS!

We have non-community resident template letters to send out, also available at www.calgarians4rd.com . Please also register with us on the website, so we may keep you up to date with any changes and events regarding the development application.

3) PLEASE MAKE SURE YOU ATTEND THE CITY OPEN HOUSES!

The more people who can attend these the better! As of the publication of this newsletter, there are three Public Information Sessions being held (please see the City's update in this newsletter for more information). The first two will be at Harvest Hills Alliance Church from 5:00-8:00 PM on Thursday, September 10th and Friday, September 11th; the third will be at the Best Western Freeport Hotel from 5:00-8:00 PM on Monday, September 14th. The City, due to early heavy input, has increased this from two sessions to three, and we are hoping more sessions will be added. Visit the city of Calgary webpage at: www.calgary.ca/harvesthills to see if additional sessions have been added!

4) JOIN THE NORTHERN HILLS COMMUNITY

ASSOCIATION! The NHCA is our official voice at all stages of the redevelopment process. NHCA is NOT in favour of this development, and we need to show the City that they have the support of the community. There's no better way to do this than get a membership for \$30 and to give them the power of numbers behind them! As a plus, many local businesses will give you up to 15% off with your card. Go to www. northernhills.ab.ca to get your membership.

We cannot stress enough the importance of every resident of the Northern Hills Communities to participate in all these activities. We understand the city has to develop, and that development in Calgary must happen. We need to manage urban sprawl while promoting proper densification in the city. However, letting developers target and cannibalize our recreational assets in the name of pure profit is not the answer. This decision for Harvest Hills will be precedent setting for how our city will continue to develop. On behalf of the Calgarians for Responsible Development, we thank you for your support in this matter. Together we can stop this development and show the city what type of city and communities WE want to live in.



How to protect yourself against scams in Calgary

The Calgary Police Service is warning the public of a number of scams and frauds in Calgary, including loan scams, on-line rental scams, utility scams and Canada Revenue Agency scams. In these scams, offenders contact victims by phone and pose as legitimate businesses in order to obtain money from victims.

In 2014, there were 35 victims in Calgary for a total of \$60,000. This year, there have been approximately 20 victims to date who have sent money in amounts ranging from several hundred to several thousand dollars.

You can protect yourself from falling victim to these scams by re Never provide personal information such as your Social Insurance Number, bank account information or credit card numbers to a business or individual without being completely certain that they have legitimate reasons for needing that information.

Install or update anti-virus software on your computer.







ball diamond, because it is our closest one....well, Airdrie's Chinook Winds Park is actually closer. We regularly fill Airdrie Urgent Care beyond capacity because the North Calgary Diagnosis and Treatment Centre approved in the 2005 Alberta budget, has still not been built, even though the land was purchased over a decade ago. Our kids spend up to two hours on a bus each day going as far as Crescent Heights High School because the North Central High School, originally in the 2004 CBE Capital Plan, has still not been built while other communities are getting new high schools, even though they were not on the list 10 years ago. Recently, \$1 million was funded towards the planning of the South East High School, which has only been in the capital plan TWO years. Airdrie now has THREE public high schools. And fewer people.

Vivo, formerly Cardel Place, is one of Calgary's smallest facilities and has had a lifetime investment by the City of Calgary of only \$28 million, but serves the largest catchment area. When the Northwest Recreation Facility opens, it will be almost 100,000 sq ft larger to serve a comparable size catchment to Vivo. The Northwest facility will cost an estimated \$191 million in comparison to the \$40-50 million that Vivo needs to expand. If you have ever tried to book swimming lessons or a summer camp with Vivo, you understand why an expansion is needed. If you have ever tried to find meeting or event space, you know Vivo needs more than the 15-20 person rooms it currently has available.

North Central Calgary has grown by 38% since 2004, and the Northern Hills has grown 104% from 28,317 residents to 57,658 people and if the proposed Harvest Hills Golf Course redevelopment is approved, we will grow to over 61,000 people. Beyond our immediate community are our neighbours Hidden Valley, Evanston, Kincora and Sage Hill for another 35,335 people that are also lacking the same infrastructure for a total nearing 95,000 people. No public high school. No health centre. No social services, family services, seniors' services,



tennis courts, athletic park. No community centre, or even meeting space.

Yet we persevere to be Calgary's best community....because of the people and our beautiful natural barriers. When a house burns and a family is found homeless, we bind together to help them out. Our community association actively advocates with elected officials to make the community better, stronger, and seek out the infrastructure we need to make us a sustainable community. We have Harvest Hills Alliance Church that goes above and beyond to provide space for everything from tutoring, moms and tots programs, election forums, and community meetings. Our community businesses provide discounts to residents that join the com-

of special interests, we are seeing our green spaces disappear, and our quality of life reduced. We only need to look at the controversial Shawnee Slopes development, which is close to transforming the Shawnee Slopes Golf Course into 1,700 residential units. Through the Calgary based Foundation for Democratic Advancement, I authored a 2013 report on the controversial Bingham Crossing Development in Springbank, Alberta, which again saw the voice of the local people ignored. You can view the Bingham Crossing report here: http://democracychange.org/2013/04/2013-fda-process-review-ofthe-bingham-crossing-development-proposal/

There are number of competing interests at stake with these development such as the agenda of the City of Calgary, interests of developers, local residents, and people who use the existing land. Unfortunately, the local residents especially those families who live adjacent to the golf courses and other spaces are oftentimes the people who feel the full brunt of the change. Obviously, the City of Calgary has to view these changes with the best interests of all Calgarians, while being sensitive to Calgarians most directly impacted.

Similar to the problems with air traffic noise and the precedence for compensation to affected residents such as the case with the expansion of the Heathrow Airport in the United Kingdom, I wonder if the Harvest Hills residents directly impacted deserve some form of financial compensation from the potential decrease in value of their homes and quality of life. If the houses adjacent to the golf course, for example, were sold as lots abuts or lots adjacent or lots across to the golf course, then the case of compensation is stronger.

I also wonder if the City of Calgary should re-evaluate its densification approach by a more balanced approach of maintaining the City's green spaces through building vertical even more in existing residential spaces, rather than allowing development on unprotected green spaces. If a private or public golf course is not being used, why not rezone it into a multi-use park? If a golf course is popular like the Harvest Hills Golf Course, why allow it to be rezoned?

Furthermore, I am concerned about how powerless local residents are, including residents who purchased in the Harvest and Coventry Hills areas

partly because of the golf course. Sure, they are given input in residential development, but they have no final say as to whether or not, the Harvest Hills Golf Course should be rezoned or not. How about the City hold a local binding referendum by Harvest and Coventry Hills residents on whether or not the golf course should be rezoned and developed? Or the City conduct an independent community wide survey of residents about the golf course status, and base the rezoning decision solely on that? These approaches in my humble opinion would represent the best interests of the residents of Harvest and Coventry Hills, and I hope all Calgarians would support such initiatives.

At the Democratic Advancement Party of Canada (DAPC), based out of Calgary, we are committed to giving Canadians greater say over significant issues that impact them. Back to school safety

Alberta Health Services EMS would like to remind parents and students about some road safety tips, as streets become more congested, with the return of the school year. Pedestrians and motorists both have an important role to play road safety is a shared responsibility.

Motorists

- Avoid talking on cell phones, texting, I. or any other behavior that diverts your attention away from driving.
- Give right-of-way to pedestrians who i have activated overhead crossing lights, or who are waiting to cross from a street corner.
- Remember, it is illegal to pass 1 vehicles - other than those that are parked - in school zones or playground zones, during posted hours.

Around school buses

- Flashing amber lights mean a bus is 1 slowing down to stop - motorists should do likewise.
- No matter which direction you are coming from, STOP, when approaching a school bus with activated flashing red lights - unless the bus is on the opposite side of a divided highway from you.
- Driver courtesy goes a long way. By simply being alert and cautious when approaching a school bus, you are contributing to school bus safety.

Pedestrians

- Cross only at marked crosswalks, or street corners that have clear visibility from all directions.
- Make eye contact with all drivers before crossing the street.
- When activating overhead crossing lights, pause before stepping off the curb to ensure motorists in both directions have come to a complete stop.
- Stay within the crosswalk lines until fully clear of the roadway.
- Obey pedestrian lights at intersections. Cross the street only when you see the 'walk' sign and only when all cars have come to a complete stop.
- If you are with young children or pets, hold your child's hand firmly and keep a solid grip on leashes when crossing.
- Remember: children learn by observing. By demonstrating safe crossing habits, you can reduce the chances of your child being involved in a preventable auto/pedestrian collision.



Green Line LRT on the Fast Track

On July 24, 2015 the Federal Government committed 1.5 billion dollars from the Public Transit Fund

to the Green Line LRT project. While this is only 1/3 of the total estimated cost of the project, we are expecting the Province to assist the City with the remaining 2/3 required to complete the project.

The LRT project which was initially 30+ years away is now slated to begin construction in 2017 with completion in 2024. This means that residents in communities along the LRT corridor will be able to enjoy the benefits of a light rail system ahead of schedule.

The Green Line will connect North Pointe, through downtown, to Seton by adding an additional 40 kilometers of track to the City's existing LRT network. It is estimated that the Green Line will service 41 million passengers annually.

Fun Facts

- The Green Line will use low-floor trains which have similar capacity to current CTrains (780 passengers/4 car train), and carry over 8 times the number of passengers of an articulated bus.
- Calgary has the first wind-powered light rail transit system in North America and reduced CO2 emissions by over 56,000 tonnes in 2012.
- 290,000 Calgarians are estimated to live along the Green Line corridor (including the Centre City and Beltline), estimated to increase to 465,000 by 2043.



announcement, but they certainly did not include us in their discussions ... so that's something we're going to have to take a look at." Since that time, questions have been raised: Is the \$1.53 billion commitment tied to federal election outcomes? Are there funding conditions regarding public/private partnerships? Can the project begin immediately, with the province adding its funding contribution at a later date? Little funding information is available at present. Clearly, the provincial government needs time to study this plan, given the surprise nature of the announcement made that morning in July. Funding aside, I like the Green Line concept as communicated on July 24 by Shane Keating, Ward 12 Councillor, and Jeff Binks, president of LRT on the Green Foundation. The Centre Street alignment makes good sense. The two final stops at North Pointe and 96 Avenue N would be well positioned as the core route of this community. I come from a transportation background and I firmly believe the Green Line will be good for Northern Hills. I will continue to support this project moving forward. Regardless of the outcome of the federal election, I hope that the funding for this project remains intact. When the LRT Green Line is a reality for the residents of Calgary Northern Hills it will be an asset for the connectivity of our communities.

So to all of you who volunteered for our casino, we give a heartfelt thank you.




