At the moment, all high school students who attend public school are bussed out of the area and the CBE has no plans for a school in our area. We have also heard the concerns that residents and service providers share regarding the lack infrastructure dedicated to Service Agencies for our area. Our communities share one recreational centre that is at capacity and looking to expand. It only makes sense that the needs of the residents in the immediate area be taken into consideration when planning such an expansion.

Stay tuned for updates on some of the upcoming discussions between the NHCA, our elected officials and managers of facilities that serve our area residents. It Was a Busy Day in June....

Despite the dodgy weather, June 18 2011 was a very busy date for the NHCA volunteers and residents of the Northern Hills. There were two major events on tap that day, each well attended and fantastically supported, that served to enhance our community spirit and green space. First out of the gate, early in the morning, was delivery of new trees destined for our community yards and boulevards under the City of Calgary "NeighborWoods" Urban Forest Renewal program. Shortly after the start of the NeighborWoods initiative, another group of NHCA volunteers started construction of our second community garden in the public park across the street from the new middle school currently under construction in Coventry Hills.

After months of planning, the NHCA and The City of Calgary doled out some 130 new trees to the participating residents and the NHCA for their yards and selected boulevards and green spaces. The program established by the City, and implemented in conjunction with volunteers from the NHCA included a workshop by trained City employees on how to plant the trees, and provided mulch and watering bags to get the trees off to a good start after planting. Based on the results from this year, the NHCA has decided to approach the City for participation again in future years. The trees were provided by Eagle Lake Nurseries through the City of Calgary and thanks to all of the folks from the City and Eagle Lake as well as the volunteers and residents who

participated in this great initiative to try and green up our communities.

Meanwhile, over in Coventry, another group of avid resident gardeners were hard at work building and planting our second community garden in the Northern Hills. This initiative was undertaken following the success of the initial community garden started in 2010 in Harvest Hills. The participants sawed and drilled the raised beds together before filling them with dirt and planting their prized seeds and seedlings. This initiative, also long in the planning, was a rousing success and a good time was had by all getting underway. Many thank to all of the folks who led, participated in and got behind this project in the interest of building a strong sense of community in the Northern Hills. I am sure there will be community gardens sprouting up in Country Hills, Panorama Hills, and perhaps other parts of the Northern Hills in the future.

We would be remiss if we didn't thank Joanne "Guerrilla Gardener" Davenport and her small army of passionate and dedicated volunteers who headed up and implemented these two great initiatives this year in the hills. You guys are Awesome!

Northern Hills Community Association – Graffiti Abatement Committee

The Graffiti Abatement Committee is a new, growing group of volunteers that share a concern about the increasing amounts of graffiti in our communities – Country Hills, Coventry Hills, Panorama Hills, Country Hills Village and Harvest Hills. We are looking for people who are willing to invest a little of their time into their community, to keep the Hills beautiful and clean for everyone to enjoy!

Why is this important?

Graffiti is often the first sign of a neighbourhood's decline. It tells crimi-

nals that we don't care about what happens in our community.

We feel less safe in our own neighborhood in the presence of graffiti and other vandalism.

It gives a poor impression of our community, and reduces our property values – sometimes as much as 15%!

What is graffiti, anyway?

Graffiti is any vandalism on public or private property that was applied without permission.

It can be paint, markers, pen or pencil. It can be painted on, scratched or

etched on, or applied as stickers.

Most graffiti in Calgary is simply a 'tag' – a way for a person to be recognized among his peers.

A small percentage – 5% or less – of Calgary graffiti is gang related, identifying territories.

Graffiti can be hate speech, targeting religious, cultural, ethnic, racial or sexual backgrounds.

It can be vulgar or offensive. It can be political in nature, or anarchist.

In all its forms, applied without permission, graffiti is illegal.

What are we doing about it?

The Graffiti Abatement Committee is creating plans and programs to combat graffiti vandalism in our neighbourhoods.

Our first focus is on reporting incidents of graffiti. Reporting is the most important, yet most neglected step in cleaning up our neighbourhood.

Keeping An Eye on Diabetes



The eye is a window to diabetes and some other diseases within the body. The prevalence of diabetes is rapidly increasing, and is the leading cause of blindness and vision loss in ages 25 – 75.

Diabetes damages the walls of the fine blood vessels within your retina, which is the nerve tissue at the back of the eye that senses light and translates it into vision. The retina is approximately the thickness of your fingernail. Blood sugar can readily enter the retina without needing insulin, so if blood glucose is too high, this is toxic to retinal tissue and causes diabetic retinopathy (DR). This damage is simultaneously happening in the fine blood vessels of kidneys and elsewhere.

Many people with DR have NO early symptoms. One can have 20/20 vision and no pain but still have DR. Often when a person notices vision loss from DR, the disease has reached an advanced stage and can be difficult to treat. Over time, diabetes can also

increase risk of glaucoma and can fast-track cataract development.

A thorough eye exam (that includes dilating the pupils for a complete retinal exam) can detect these problems before they impair vision. A diabetic can minimize the effects on the eyes by maintaining tight control of blood sugar levels. The good news is that when you take the right steps to manage diabetes, this also helps control high blood pressure or elevated cholesterol, as these are often linked together in Metabolic Syndrome.

Medicare is promoting health prevention, as this is less tax payer dollars than attempting to repair the damage by surgery on eyes, or kidney dialysis and transplant. If you have been diagnosed with diabetes, a diabetes eye exam is covered by Alberta Health Care, and you do not need a referral to see an optometrist. Take a moment to focus on your eyes.

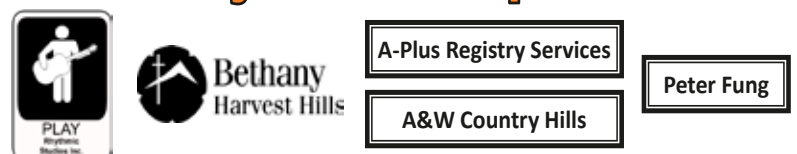

Community Garden Update

This spring:

Transit News

Calgary Transit has launched its express airport service pilot program. The program will be provided on a trial basis for a six month period from downtown to Calgary International Airport. What is particularly advantageous for Ward 4 residents is the new Route 300 makes three convenient stops along Centre Street at 40th, 56th and 64th Avenues on its way to the airport. I was in the vicinity of the 40th

Street stop recently and it appeared passengers have already adopted the service. Fare structure is a bit different from regular transit. Going to the airport the fare is the usual cost. Departing from the airport costs eight dollars unless the passenger carries a monthly Calgary transit pass which covers the cost of the trip. For more information on the route, visit the Calgary Transit website at www.calgarytransit.com or contact 3-1-1. Should ridership support this service, it will be offered on a regular basis until the proposed North Central LRT becomes operational in the future.

Speaking of which, the three open houses conducted in the spring proved there is a great

deal of interest in the proposed line. 1200 people attended the meetings while another 1000 weighed in online. The purpose of these consultations, one of which was held at the Huntington Hills Community Association, was to familiarise residents with the three potential routes under consideration: Centre Street N, Edmonton Trail NE and a line shadowing the current CPR tracks to the east. Transit will be meeting with the Community Volunteer Committee shortly to evaluate the comments gathered at the open houses. The communities will be contacted in the fall regarding the feedback from these consultations.

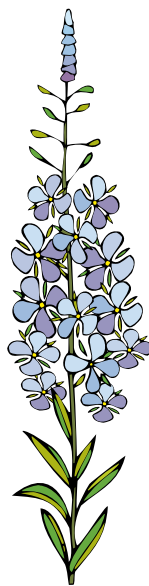

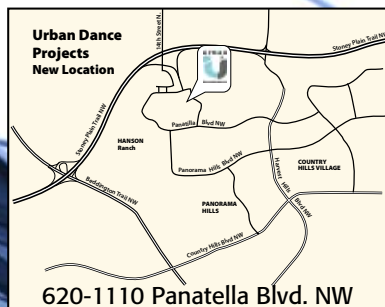
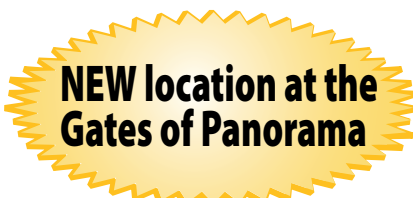

Safe and Considerate Fire Pit Usage

An evening around a fire pit is a favourite pastime for many Calgarians. The City of Calgary Animal & Bylaw Services partners with citizens to help ensure high standards of public health and safety: this includes the regulation of fire pits as outlined in the Community Standards Bylaw.

Animal & Bylaw Services receives many complaints related to excessive smoke from fire pits. This is often a result of burning improper materials. Only clean dry firewood is permitted to be burned in fire pits. You cannot burn treated or painted lumber, wet or unseasoned wood, lumber containing glue or resin, yard waste such as leaves or grass, garbage, rubber, plastic or any animal parts. It is also important to check the wind conditions prior to lighting a fire. High wind speed can pose a fire hazard and similarly, if the wind speed is low, the air quality is poor and fire pit smoke will not dissipate.

For the safety of Calgarians and their neighbours, fire pits must be located at least two metres from houses, fences, trees and any other combustible structures. Fire pits must be



constructed of non-combustible materials and we suggest having a metal grill or screen to prevent sparks or embers from escaping. Fires must be supervised at all times and owners must have a way, such as a hose, present and readily available to extinguish the fire.

The "Fire on Premises" section of the Community Standards Bylaw includes the following fire pit regulations:

Burn only clean, dry firewood.

Fire pit must be situated at least two metres from a building, structure or any combustible material and can't be located under trees or branches. If a fire

pit is found to be in contravention of the bylaw, the property owner will be required to remove or modify it.

- An open flame can't exceed one metre at its widest point.
- Owners must have a way to extinguish the fire.
- All fires must be supervised at all times.
- Fires are not allowed between 1 a.m. and 10 a.m.
- Fire pits can't be used during a fire ban. Failing to abide by this rule can result in a \$1000 penalty.

When fire pits are used safely and properly, they can provide many hours of enjoyment and neighbours can continue to live in harmony with one another. Let's work together to make sure our nights spent by the fire are safe and fun for all Calgarians.



In-line Skating Safety

In-line skating is a popular recreational activity in the summer. It is excellent physical conditioning and exercise. Skaters can be found most everywhere that bicyclists, skateboarders, and joggers go. As the number of people using in-line skates has increased, so has the number of injuries resulting from this activity. Fortunately, most in-line skating injuries can be prevented by following some basic safety tips.

CHECK YOUR EQUIPMENT

- Choose good quality skates that fit your feet properly. Loose skates will not provide enough ankle support or control.
- As with cycling, ensure your helmet is in good repair. Replace any helmet that has been in a crash even if it appears undamaged.

WEAR THE GEAR

- Most injuries suffered by in-line skaters are due to a lack of basic safety gear worn by the participant when an incident occurs.
- Protective gear includes a CSA approved helmet, knee and elbow pads, and wrist guards.
- Wearing protective gear every time you skate will reduce your chance of injury.

ON THE PATH

- Recognize your limitations, especially when you are new at in-line skating. Most in-line skating injuries are caused by loss of control when navigating down hills or negotiating turns.
- Novice skaters are advised to learn skating on a flat, grassy surface until they have the feel of in-line skates. This will allow for the safe practise of standing and balancing on your skates.
- Keep your eyes and ears open for hazards as you skate. Do not wear headphones while you are skating, especially when crossing streets or level train crossings.
- Stay to the right of the path when skating unless you need to pass.
- Always pass on the left. Call out "passing on your left" to alert others you are approaching.

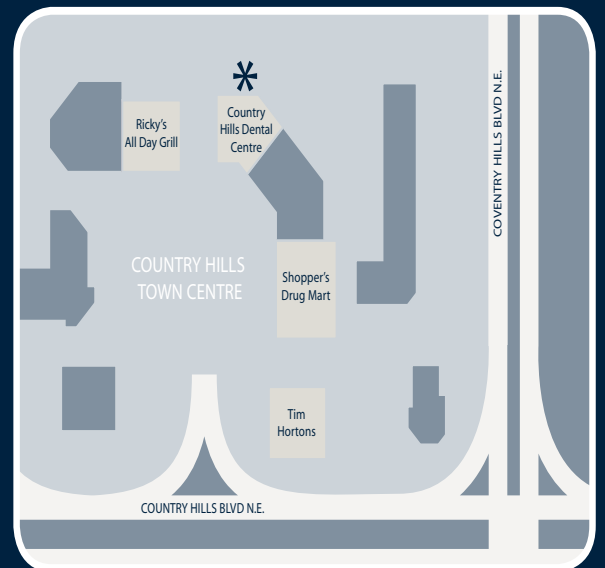
