The Advocates for North Calgary High School (ANCHS) organized and hosted a successful rally on Sunday September 15. Well over 100 Northern Hills neighbours, elected representatives, and supporters rallied in the field across from Nose Creek School - the parcel of land waiting for North Calgary High School (NCHS) these past 15 years.

ANCHS Chair, Kasia Gajewska, opened the rally by thanking everyone for their attendance, and invited a slate of speakers to address the crowd. David Hartwick shared some history of North Calgary High School,

as he has been advocating for this school for 15+ years. MLA's Yaseen and Sawhney both pledged to fight for full construction funding for North Calgary High School in the upcoming provincial budget, sharing personal stories of long commutes to school in their own families. Also speaking to the gathered crowd were CBE Trustee Althea Adams and Councillor Gondek, both tireless advocates.

Trustee Adams has worked to move North Calgary High School to a top priority in the CBE Capital Plan. Currently, NCHS is #2 priority, and design funding was allocated by the provincial government in the March 2018 budget. The Design process is now underway, more information

Full construction funding in this fall's provincial budget will ensure a smooth transition into construction of the school, with potential opening in fall 2023.




Creating Coventry Update

PROJECT 1: COVENTRY SPORT COURT & RINK

This is not the project update I wanted to have to write, but unfortunately at the time of writing (September 12th) we still don't know the outcome

of our January application for a Provincial Community Facility Enhancement Program (CFEP) grant that was due to be decided by July 15th. Due to this continued delay, we won't



be able to build the winter water supply box and planter seating for this project until next construction season (2020) at the earliest.

Our MLA, Minister Rajan Sawhney, has been kindly helping me to find out why we didn't hear in July as originally planned. It appears that due to the delay in the Provincial Government budget, many community groups and schools throughout the province are still waiting to hear if their applications are going to be either granted or refused. After being given several different timelines of when we would know by over the past month and a half, thanks to Minister Sawhney last week I had a call from the head of the Provincial CFEP grants, and even she doesn't have a timeline for when all the applicants will be told either way. Our application has been processed, but we have neither been approved nor declined yet. They are now waiting to see how much funding CFEP will have available to allocate. However, they may not be able to tell us until November, which means we can't plan to put anything else in this year as outdoor park construction season will be over due to the frozen ground by the time we receive any funding, assuming there is enough budgeted to CFEP and we are approved.

Sadly, due to this delay, we will also have to use some planned applications for other grants, that were due to be used for our other community projects, to apply for funding for the rink's winter water supply just in case we don't get an approval from CFEP, or we may lose another year. This sets back the other projects (dog park, 5 SE Coventry Parks project, etc), too.

Sorry for the bad news, folks, and

thanks for your patience as we work through this setback.

We do have some good news though: we were approved for a Parks Foundation & Saddledome Foundation Amateur Sport Grant of \$20,000 this summer! This grant is contingent on us fundraising full funding for the project, so don't forget: any little donations from

In the meantime, it has been an absolute JOY to see so many people of all ages using and sharing the basketball court not only for basketball, but for teaching littles to ride a bike, skateboarding, roller skating, scooters and more. We are elated that this has become such a well-used and loved community asset!

PROJECT 6: POLLINATOR CORRIDOR – NATURALIZATION PILOT

The pollinator corridor is growing really well! We have been out to weed twice now to remove the mustard and Canadian Thistle that came in on the soil, but due to the wet summer we've had, we haven't needed to water much (silver lining?). We've been checking it regularly and there are new flowers peeking through every month. We hope next year it will be even better and we'll have flowers blooming all through the spring, summer and fall.

PROJECT #7: COVENTRY UTILITY CORRIDOR ACTIVATION

Another bit of sunshine is that we have an #ActivateYYC grant to activate the TUC and the results of the survey are shown here. The overwhelming majority chose an idea supplied by a Coventry teen at our in-person engagement: a social space (potentially with a water feature).

A Coventry resident has kindly offered to build a community picnic table for us, and we are investigating how to install a small, solar powered water feature. We also hope to install some doggie poop bag holders along the trail, to help make it more pleasant for all users of this space.


