Only 15 years after the North Calgary High School first hit the CBE capital plan, finally ... IT'S OUR TURN!

This is a huge milestone for our community, for all high school advocates, and the residents of North-Central Calgary. The 2018 Alberta provincial budget allocated design funding for North Calgary High School, and now this recent announcement allocates full construction funding, which means shovels can go in the ground once the design process has been completed.

This announcement wouldn't have happened without the tireless dedication and advocacy from this community. You attended the high school rallies, you spoke at CBE trustee meetings, you gave feedback during CBE engagement sessions, your wrote letters, sent emails, and made phone calls to your elected officials. Quite frankly, without your stepping up and speaking out, who knows how much longer we would have had to wait.







ACTIVATE YYC & THE COVENTRY NORTH UTILITY CORRIDOR

If you follow us on social media (@CreatingCoventry on Facebook or @CreatingCovYYC on Twitter) or are part of the Coventry community groups on Facebook, you'll know that we recently installed a community picnic table and pet waste bag holders in the north portion of the Coventry Utility Corridor, thanks to a small, #ActivateYYC grant. At the time of writing, we are looking at possibly installing some additional solar lighting, to help make the space more welcoming during those darker,

winter afternoons, and will install a small water feature in springsummer 2020.

Despite the freezing rain on November 3rd, some residents and dog walkers came out to help us celebrate its installation with hot chocolate, and our aim of bringing locals together to get to know each other has already been achieved! An unfortunate vandalism event also had a silver lining: within 2 hours of the vandalism being reported on the community Facebook pages, a resident had brought his tools out into the dark and repaired the damage. New Traffic Safety Improvements In Panorama Hills

Pedestrian safety around the hools in our community is a serious concern for many residents who observe speeding in playground zones, low pedestrian visibility, distracted drivers, accidents, congestion, jaywalking, and parking in non-designated unsafe locations. These were some of the main challenges that motivated the parents on the Buffalo Rubbing Stone School Council to reach out to the City of Calgary seeking ways to improve the safety of children crossing the roads around Buffalo Rubbing Stone K-5 Elementary School; located less than a block from the new Stoney Trail & 14 St. interchange project projected to open in the summer of 2021.

City Councillor Jyoti Gondek and her team welcomed the opportunity to collaborate with our group, actively listened to our concerns, offered creative solutions and in less than two months was able to implement a significant number of improvements around the perimeter of the School with a positive impact!

Improving the safety and visibility of pedestrians by slowing down drivers included:

- A continuous 30km playground zone that stretches the entire length of Panatella Hill from Panatella Blvd by BRS School to Captain Nicola Goddard School.
- A 20 minute loading and no parking zone in front of the school & new traffic signs.
- Traffic calming curbs near Panton Rise crosswalk.
- No u-turn signs near crosswalks.
- Reflective sleeves on pedestrian crossing signposts & zebra crossing road markings.
- Calgary Parking Authority patrols.

HEALTH CORNER



Winter Shoveling!

Winter, the glorious season of skiing, snowshoeing, snowboarding and hopefully, loads and loads of snow! And with snow, comes shoveling.

In my work as a yoga therapist I see people every winter who become injured after shoveling heavy snow. I look at movement patterns to help people become aware and learn how to move better, so they can get through another season of snow shoveling and still enjoy the activities they love.

The largest and most stable joint in your body is your pelvis and moving better through your pelvis and legs makes you stronger and be able to adapt to different

movements.

Last month we looked at how your leg bones move in your pelvis, and today we will explore how your pelvis moves on your legs. Ideally, your pelvis should be able to move easily on your legs. If your pelvis can move, you can transfer load through your system much better. Better transfer of load = easier shoveling!

To begin, stand with one foot forward and one foot back, with your feet lined up like they are on little train tracks. Place your hands on your hips, and feel the structure of your pelvis. Bend your front knee and imagine that your pelvis is like a bowl full of water. With your legs steady, begin to move the pelvis as though you are pouring the water out the front of the bowl. Notice

if you initiate the movement from your back, or from your pelvis. It is common for people to want to move from the back, and a more sustainable way to move is to move from the largest joint, your pelvis. Move in and out of this about 5 times and then hold for 5 breaths. You may notice your legs and glutes firing up! Make sure to do both sides. This is a great exercise to practice every few days as long as it doesn't hurt. Make sure to move in your pain-free range to get the most benefit from your movement practice.




