





For everyone's safety, it is important for motorists to understand how to correctly yield right of way to emergency vehicles with lights and siren active. You can help EMS, police, and fire get to the scene quickly and safely by following these rules of the road.

When an emergency vehicle approaches with lights and siren activated:

 If you're in the middle of an intersection when an emergency vehicle approaches with lights and siren activated, safely clear the intersection;

 On a one or two lane road, motorists should move to the right side of the road, slow down, and then stop, remaining parallel with the road. Remember to signal;

 Move right or left to the nearest curb on 1way streets.

 On a road with three or more lanes, motorists should move to the nearest side of the road and stop. If driving in the centre lane, move to the right side of the road and stop. Remember to signal;

 Come to a complete stop and wait for the emergency vehicle to pass. Shoulder check for more emergency vehicles before reentering traffic flow. Remember to signal;

• Emergency vehicles might use any available road space to maneuver. This could include shoulders or turning lanes, etc., in order to pass other traffic. When operating a vehicle:

 Motorists must reduce speed to 60 km/h or the posted speed, whichever is lower, when passing emergency vehicles or tow trucks that are stopped with their lights flashing. This law applies to the lane(s) immediately next to the stopped vehicles. If you're not in the lane next to the stopped vehicles, it is recommended to reduce speed and leave lots of space between yourself and emergency personnel.

 Do not break the rules of the road in order to give right of way to an emergency vehicle. This could include proceeding through a red light, or making an illegal turn. Actions such as these jeopardize all motorists in the area;

• Drivers must place their full attention on the roadway and toward the safe operation of their vehicle at all times. The fine for distracted driving in Alberta is \$300.00 and three demerit points;

 Do not drive within 150 meters of an emergency vehicle with its siren and/or flashing lights on. For reference, 150 m is nearly 1.5 times the length of a football field.



What is a Snow Angel?

Snow Angels keep an eye out for neighbours who may need a lending hand with removing snow from the sidewalk and driveways. The City of Calgary's Snow Angel Program was the first of its kind and has been recreated in many other cities in Canada. As it gains popularity, so do the mass amounts of Snow Angels all over Canada. By shovelling someone's sidewalk or driveway, Snow Angels are so much more than good neighbours, and they can save lives!

Benefits of Snow Angels

When Mother Nature gives us a day with heavy snowfall, Calgary paramedics have reported seeing a dramatic increase in heart-related calls. For older adults or those with physical disabilities, this risk is drastically increased. The combination of cold air and heavy lifting causes strain on the heart, which leads to cardiac distress. One way to reduce this risk for neighbours is by initiating a Snow Angel Program in your community!

Many people who are elderly or immobile love living in the same house they've made a home, and some are limited in their abilities to remove snow and fear the loss of their homes or having to leave the communities they love. By helping neighbours with snow removal, you can make them feel secure staying in their homes!

Having a Snow Angel Campaign is an excellent way of showing your community association cares! Social isolation can be a significant factor in having low quality of life. For some, daily interactions with their Snow Angels can provide a source of community inclusion and pride.

WAV Calgary speedily dispatches on-demand wheelchair accessible taxis

The average wait time for people requesting taxis that are wheelchair accessible has dropped to 15-18 minutes from hours thanks to a dispatch service launched in 2019.

WAV Calgary (Wheelchair Accessible Vehicle Calgary) is an on-demand, centralized dispatch service for wheelchair accessible taxis. It pools the services of active, licenced wheelchair accessible taxis and drivers operating in the city and provides customers with one point of contact to request an accessible taxi.

The goal of WAV Calgary is to reduce wait times and improve service levels by providing customers with more accurate wait time information for the closest accessible taxi. The 15-18-minute wait time is comparable to other taxi services in Calgary, where the wait time goal is 15 minutes.

Customers can contact WAV Calgary 24 hours a day to book an accessible taxi via phone (403-974-1110), website (WAVCalgary.com) or app (available for both Android and Apple devices).

WAV Calgary has continued to operate throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, ensuring customers have access to safe transportation in accessible taxis, which provide door-to-door service in private vehicles.

The City of Calgary is committed to identifying solutions for providing efficient taxi service to those individuals requiring a wheelchair accessible taxi.

The City regulates the taxi industry in Calgary and is monitoring the wheelchair accessible service. Customers are encouraged to call 311 with compliments and complaints. All complaints are investigated.

Snow Bans Restricted Parking map: Online map shows Calgary's snow route parking bans

December marks the potential for snowfall in the city and this means snow bans can come into effect. Know which routes are snow routes before making an outing to ensure a smooth trip and ease of parking – use The City of Calgary's online map that shows banned parking locations. The Snow Route Parking Bans map shows where parking is temporarily restricted on designated snow routes. Parking bans may last up to 72 hours following a parking ban being issued by The City. Women in STEM scholarship opens for applications

This second intake for the Women in STEM scholarship, which was introduced earlier this year, demonstrates the Alberta government's commitment to supporting women in pursuing rewarding careers in these fields. Each successful applicant will receive \$2,500 to support their studies. The scholarship is open to women currently studying in STEM fields. The deadline for applications is Dec. 31. Kananaskis Conservation Pass on track for success

On June 1 the Alberta government introduced the Kananaskis Conservation Pass. Since then, more than 253,000 passes have been issued, generating more than \$10 million in revenue. Every dollar from the pass is being used to enhance visitor experiences, with revenues going to trail maintenance, visitor services, search and rescue operations, waste management and the upkeep of facilities in Kananaskis Country. Revenues from the pass have allowed Alberta's government to hire 20 additional conservation officers and 32 new seasonal positions. Transportation

As part of Alberta's Recovery Plan, our government is providing new opportunities for residents by building, diversifying, and creating jobs. The remainder of the Southwest (SWCRR) Calgary Ring Road opened on October 2, following five years of construction. The 31-kilometre project created more than 3,700 jobs. The focus is now on the West (WCRR) Calgary Ring Road, with full completion anticipated in 2024. At that time the Calgary Ring Road will provide 101 kilometres of free-flow travel, which will enhance access to markets and support economic growth. I am also very happy to report that the widening of a portion of northeast Stoney Trail was completed earlier this summer, ahead of schedule and on budget. The additional lanes will alleviate traffic congestion in the area and improve safety for those who travel on this section of the ring road. **Alberta Biz Connect**

According to the Government of Canada, aging in place means, "having the health and social supports and services you need to live safely and independently in your home or your community for as long as you wish and are able." Notice the key words in the definition, 'health supports', According to a National Survey, 78% of Canadians want to age in place but only 26% are able to do so.



'social supports' and 'services.' These are also the key considerations that should guide the planning process.

1. Will my current home meet the changing needs of aging?

To accommodate changing health needs and delay the need for a future move, making an assessment of the living arrangement now will save time, money and stress. Key considerations include whether or not to modify the existing home or move to a bungalow or condo. Each of these decisions will have a financial impact.



2. Is the community age-friendly so that I can still stay active and engaged?

Should a move be necessary, pay attention to the presence (or absence) of decent infrastructure that supports and encourages independently living such as good transportation, clear sidewalks, proximity to family and friends, shopping, medical, dental and other services.

3. Staying healthy and connected

This by far is the most important consideration through which everything else becomes possible. Look for pathways, parks and green spaces for walking, jogging and other leisure activities. Having the infrastructure that supports an active lifestyle is an advantage that should not be overlooked.

By investing time and effort into research and planning about the future, life transitions can be a journey of new adventures and fresh beginnings!






