The City will be making repairs to the Adopt a Rink site in Panorama Hills this spring and we are working on finding a location for the proposed rink in Coventry Hills. From the initial planning on through the land use application and the construction of the required infrastructure this is truly a remarkable achievement.

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



SPRY and Community Consultations

SPRY in the Hills was one of the first Community Consultations on the Creating Space for Strength Project. We had 17 seniors come out to share their ideas on what is working, what can be better and how do we get there.

A few of the themes that emerged were:

- Space for seniors to meet that is affordable, accessible and easy to get to
- Increased access to health care more doctors, laboratories and testing services, a variety of Senior living and care facilities in our community
- Increased public transit services more buses, inter community routes, improve current services

One group identified the need to have a list of trustworthy handymen, volunteers or trade people who can help them with things around their home. A concrete result of this meeting was that the seniors have mobilized themselves to take on this project and will create a list of reliable people they can trust to come into

their homes. A volunteer has stepped up to take the lead on this project. Residents in our Community are requested to submit ideas, or volunteer, for this list to seniors@northernhills.ab.ca

We also came up with several other concrete action steps that we will take on – like a letter writing campaign to our Alderman, MLA, MP, and AHS covering the above topics. We are hoping to meet with Cardel Staff/Board so that we can give Senior input into their programs, instructors, schedule, and costs.

As a follow-up, we are working on arranging to meet with Alderman Stevenson this Spring. A few of the topics we are expecting to cover are Senior bus passes, Senior rates at Cardel Place, bus service, Senior Services in the Community and are requesting





all Seniors in the Community to submit to us their concerns so we can ascertain what other concerns are and relay this to our Alderman for him to gather information to bring to this meeting. Please forward your concerns, as soon as possible, to <u>seniors@</u> <u>northernhills.ab.ca</u> and watch for more information on this meeting. All Seniors are welcome to attend this meeting.

SPRY in the Hills continues to grow and at times we find that the space we use at the Panorama Hills e-Community Centre gets a bit tight so the Creating Space Project cannot come to fruition soon enough for our program. Do not let this stop you from joining us.....we can always make room for a few more! Please plan to attend a meeting soon.

UPDATE! Creating Space for Strength

An Asset-Based Community Development Project Focussed on Calgary's North Central Communities

As you are likely aware, the Northern Hills Community Association (NHCA) is working on a project designed to find out what our communities' strengths and assets are, what can be improved, and how. A Calgary-based consulting firm, Eaton International Consulting Inc. was hired to help us conduct this study. We are particularly interested in hearing your opinions about our strengths, some of the problems faced by our community, particularly in terms of space, and what solutions we can generate to build an even greater community.

- The goals of the research project are to:
- identify pre-existing community assets such as community spaces, services, and programs;
- collect Calgary neighbourhood information and data;
- highlight untapped community strengths and assets that could be better utilized in Calgary's north central communities;
- determine what services and programs are currently available in the identified communities; and
- develop an action plan to move forward.
- The following summarizes our progress on the various project phases:
- Phase 1 Collecting demographical information (Complete)
- Phase 2 Survey of the community support services and group meeting/activity spaces available in the community (Complete)
- Phase 3 Individual and face-to-face interviews with a sample of the community to determine resident needs (Partially Complete)
- Phase 4 Roundtable discussions with the community to validate and build on face-to-face interviews (Partially Complete)
- Phase 5 Gather information related to models of community multi-purpose sites and the various aspects of integrated services and collaboration between service providers (Not Started)
- Phase 6 Build a community action plan specific to the needs of the community (Not Started)
- Phase 7 Writing the final report (Not Started)

*Work plan dates are flexible and may vary as the project progresses.

We recently (February 21) completed a very successful consultation session with about 60 Northern Hills Residents in round table discussion format to gather information, opinions and ideas on our strengths and needs for the community, and for community development, and are now assessing the data and information for completeness to be used in the next steps in the process. 

A MESSAGE FROM WARD 3

Many of you have read or listened to reports of the 96th Avenue NE Extension. The project quality assurance investigations in the summer of 2012 determined that there was evidence of deficiencies on all bridge decks currently under construction over Nose Creek and the CP Railway tracks. Further investigation revealed that there were no structural concerns with three of the bridge decks, and that they could be made operational by crack sealing and completion of the deck finishes as per the contract.

The most significant deficiency is with the westbound bridge deck over Nose Creek and it is clear that major remedial work may be required to bring this bridge deck into operation and to ensure that it meets The City's durability requirements. These construction deficiencies have had an impact on the opening of the roadway which was originally scheduled for Fall of 2012.

It was hoped that the necessary work on the three bridge decks could have been completed in November 2012, with the goal of opening half the roadway to traffic (i.e. two-way traffic on the original eastbound carriageway). However, when the colder temperatures and winter conditions set in, work on the bridge decks was suspended until Spring 2013 when warmer temperatures will allow the work to be completed on the three bridge decks. Once the eastbound bridge decks are completed, The City plans to open them up for two-way traffic, allowing motorists to use the roadway between Harvest Hills Boulevard and the Airport Trail/Deerfoot Trail interchange. The entire roadway (both eastbound and westbound lanes) will open once the work on the fourth bridge deck has been completed.

I had a Notice of Motion go to Council on January 14, 2013 regarding Playground/School Zone Safety. Council directed Administration, including Roads, in conjunction with the Calgary Police Service to investigate alternative measures, including but not limited to rumble strips, to improve driver awareness of entering playground and school zones. It will also develop options based on best practices and experience in

other jurisdictions. Administration is to report back to Council through the SPC on Transportation & Transit with findings of the investigation and a recommendation for a pilot project, for consideration by Council no later than 2013 May.


spring calendar."
