RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Chicken Curry – South Indian Style

Prep Time: 10 minutes **Cook Time:** 30 minutes Serves:

Ingredients:


- 9 lbs chicken
- 1 large onion or 2 small ones
- 2 medium sized tomatoes
- 2 tablespoons ginger garlic paste
- 1 cinnamon sticks
- 1 bay leaf
- · 1 tablespoon aniseed (saunf)
- 4 cloves
- 2 or 3 cardamom
- 1 teaspoon chilli powder (add more depending on the level of spiciness
- 1 teaspoon coriander powder
- 1 tablespoon (optional) curd or white yogurt
- 100 grams coconut
- Oil as requires
- Few curry leaves
- Garnish with cilantro or coriander leaves

Directions:

Wash chicken (with bones or boneless) and keep aside. Heat oil in a pressure cooker or pan and add the dry spices (cinnamon, bay leaves, aniseed, cloves, cardamom and curry leaves) along with chopped onions. Mix with salt to quicken the process; when onions become transparent, add the ginger garlic paste and stir-fry for two minutes and then add the tomatoes. Add the chicken pieces once the above mixture thickens and sauté. Add turmeric, chilli and coriander powder. After the masala blends into the chicken, add curd and water as required (depending on level of gravy required, 2 to 3 cups of water). Close the pressure cooker and wait for 2 to 3 whistles and take off. If cooking in a pan, cover with a lid and cook until the chicken is cooked.

While the chicken is cooking, grind the coconut along with the aniseed (saunf) into a fine paste and add it to the chicken and let it boil until you can see the oil on top of the gravy. Remove from stove and add coriander leaves to garnish. Serve with rice or roti bread.



What is Blue Light Hazard?

If you use a lot of electronic devices like TVs, computers, smartphones and tablets, and have LED lighting, you are exposed to blue light or high energy visible (HEV) light.

Blue light is part of the visible light spectrum that can cause damage to your eyes. Blue light exposure after sundown may also disrupt sleep cycles.

Blue light's shorter wavelength creates light scatter within the eye, causing glare and eye fatigue. It also penetrates into the eye potentially damaging retinal cells. Cumulative lifetime exposure can increase the risk of age-related macular degeneration. Children's eyes filter blue light less efficiently than adults, which means children are more susceptible to the effects of blue light hazard.


