NHCA Women's Soccer

Women's soccer is not only alive and well in the Hills, but it is growing! No more the days of only watching our kids on the field, on the ice or on the pitch - the kids are now coming to watch their mom's play. Whether or not you have been aware of the Northern Hills women's soccer program right here in your community, they have been working diligently every year since their start back in 2005 to promote the sport of soccer. Regardless of the fact that the league has doubled in size, Janice Henderson, Coordinator of the women's soccer league and Sports Director for the Northern Hills Community Association, along with her team, are constantly recruiting new members. Why? For the love of the game. When Janice was asked, she said, "It's about the social, physical and mental benefits that each player gains from this game. The reason I keep looking to recruit is to help women love the game of soccer, to have that hour on the field where you are just chasing after the ball without a care in the world."

The league consists of close to 200 women, a mix of new players and as well as those that have been playing since close to inception. Giselle Inkpen is one of those players. She started playing in 2007. "I thought it was a good idea to socialize with other women in the community, an opportunity to get out and do something for myself." Asked about some of the changes she has seen since joining, "When I joined there were only 4 teams, the league has now doubled. We used to play at one location, now there are different locations through the community. Not only that, but they have also added an Indoor program and we can sign up for tournaments to compete against teams from different communities."

The Northern Hills soccer program runs all year long. The outdoor program runs from May to June, offering two games per week, all played on the fields in our local communities. The Indoor

program runs from October to March, teams playing one game per week, played at the Genesis Centre. The uniqueness of Northern Hills soccer comes from the fact that it allows women of any skill level to participate. The program offers technical training before the start of each season. This soccer training consists of developing the player's fundamental soccer skills as well as their understanding of the game. Training sessions are progressed from beginner to advanced levels of technical skill. Giselle recalls the lack of training available back in 2007 "when I joined, technical training was one night in a gym, led by one of the player's husband." It has since evolved from one session to 5-6 training sessions with a certified trainer. This is an unbelievable opportunity to learn from some of the best. German Comacho, the technical trainer for Northern Hills has been coaching for over 10 years in several clubs, ranging from youth and adult all the way to college-level. He has a background as a certified personal trainer and a district referee. In addition to attending a coaching clinic with Barcelona FC from Spain, he is currently working towards achieving his National C license, accredited by the U.S Soccer Federation. "It's critical that each player build a strong foundation in technical

and tactical areas, while at the same time, having fun regardless of their skill level."

Pam Tokunaga is also part of the women's soccer program and is experiencing her first year as a soccer player. She heard about the league though a friend and having just made a personal challenge to try something new it was the perfect time to sign up. "I didn't have any experience prior to joining so there was definitely an intimidation factor that came into play." But after asking some questions and a bit of convincing from her husband, she decided to give it a try. Asked about some of the benefits since joining, Pam did not hesitate "I've seen a lot of benefits since joining. I had recently lost 40 lbs

prior to registering, so I was trying to find ways to stay motivated. Playing soccer is a nice stress relief and a little competitiveness never hurt anyone. The women I've met are wonderful. It can be intimidating to play with women who are more experienced in the sport but I've had the pleasure of being surrounded by very supportive, encouraging and patient team mates.

Why do women decide to join and then continue to play the sport of soccer? Because it is indeed a beautiful game. If you ask Janice, Giselle, Pam and most any of the women currently part of the league, they continue to play because soccer offers anyone who joins the chance to no longer sit on the sidelines, to be part of the community, to meet new people and create some lifelong friendships.



The Northern Hills still lacks the Urgent Care facility and public high school that both should have been built a decade ago, LRT, social services, senior services, family services, community meeting space and ice rinks for the existing 56000 residents so how do we accommodate more people? How do we accommodate the traffic increases, particularly on Country Hills Boulevard as a result of the influx of more residents?

The NHCA regularly addresses the infrastructure and service deficiencies within North Central Calgary, with little success thus far. However, we have seen many of the residents of Harvest Hills rise together as one voice to oppose this development and we are inviting all residents of the Northern Hills to join us at the Best Western Freeport Inn March 11th. There will be a session held at 6pm and a second one at 730pm, to learn more about this development and the impact it could have on everyone. April continues to be a very busy month for many volunteers, as we bring on hundreds of parent volunteers as there is still much that has to be done before the kids hit the fields in the following month. We will be determining where the children will be playing, booking fields accordingly, making game schedules for all the different age groups, making team equipment bags, and we

bring all the coaches/team managers in for an orientation. We then give the coaches the prepared equipment bags with a box of pre-ordered jerseys. The coaches are also put through a day of soccer on the field by a technical trainer. The soccer lines are also done the week before the children start, but this isn't an easy task with all the rain we tend to get at this time of the year.

May – it's a wonderful month! All the hard work pays off as the children are so excited to get to the fields and meet their teams and their coaches. They can't wait to get their jerseys, shorts, and socks. It is truly amazing to come to the field and watch these golden moments. To watch the coaches having a great time while working hard as they teach their new teams some soccer skills and how to work together on the field. Just standing there watching the parents line up their lawn chairs, sitting or standing and encouraging not only their own children, but also cheering on other teammates. It's truly magical. Team and individual pictures are taken early in the month.

June – the players are still so excited to be on those fields, playing soccer, sometimes they have to fight the elements of rain, wind, cold temperatures, mosquito's, but still they dress appropriately and show up! Coaches too, they always show up ready with new ideas, new drills, activities to keep the children learning. The month goes by very quickly as every June does, but not without a wind up event, pictures being handed out, and medals for every participant. The season ends at the same time as the school lets out.

So much to do, but for great reasons! I look forward to the 2015 Children's Season and working together with several key individuals putting together a great soccer program for your children.



NHCA Men's Soccer League expected to Grow again in its Third Year!

Last year 100 players registered, which increased from the first year of 79 players; went from 4 teams in 2013 to 5 teams in 2014. The season kicks off with technical and skills development in April and then starting May, twice per week (Monday & Thursday) the men play games. The focus is on fun, health and community engagement with the program catering to players of all abilities.

The league is open to men with all levels of playing experience living in or outside Northern Hills, but an NHCA membership is required. Ali

Bryan an organizer of the league says "There are many benefits to playing soccer in your own neighborhood. People are busy. A set schedule and close fields make it easy to coordinate activities with the other members of your household. It's also a great way to network and socialize with community members and a simple way to integrate fitness into your spring calendar." A couple of people were asked why they joined. Ivon Mbuyamba mentioned "I joined for a number of reasons: to stay in good shape, play outside (in the open air); to try something new and different and just have fun." When asked if he enjoyed the season "I did enjoy the season because all the above expectations were met. I had the opportunity to meet and talk to a number of interesting people. There was also a healthy level of competitiveness which I enjoyed along with good sportsmanship."

Octaviano Salgado when asked about what he thought of last year's program said "Great preseason training and lots of fun playing against my neighbours. Yes, I certainly enjoyed it. I was able to meet great people who came out to play for fun and build their soccer skills. The schedule was just right for my hectic life." When asked what made him join "Great opportunity to get back at playing soccer nearby home." I pressed him a bit further as he is a captain of our Red team and asked what would you like to accomplish this year "I would spend more time getting to know my teammates to create a more engaging and dynamic group to win more games and above all build longstanding relational friendships." I asked him if he was coming back "I want to be more active with the events that my community, Northern Hills is providing my neighbours and residents."

Dave Bryan sent an email to the organizers late last spring suggesting that we extend the season throughout the summer and into September. Due to the overwhelming success of the extended season "Players this year have an option when registering, they can play for just May and June or they can play a longer season from May through September" says Janice Henderson, Men's Coordinator. "Our program offers tremendous value. In addition to the pre-season training and games, which are overseen by licensed referees, the registration fee includes a kick-off event and a yearend party."

Jorge Molina, the Green Teams captain echoed those thoughts saying "I'm exited to return to the league on its 3rd year. The friendships and memories from moments playing have been priceless. Not to mention the friendships with players from

other teams due to our unique opportunity to "top off" players when short or through our post game mixers. Whether you are new to the area, want to meet people or re-live those days when you played organized soccer this is a great environment to feel young again with like-minded soccer enthusiasts. It does not matter what team you cheer for or the continent in the world you have roots in; the environment is welcoming and flexible to your abilities. It's the kind of soccer you can play at your own skill level or improve on without pressure. I have played at different levels, coached various age groups but I joined to have fun, get off the couch and meet my area neighbours. The cost is reasonable and the value without question is un-comparable. It's a beautiful game and I can't wait for the season

Register before March 15th, as there will be a maximum of six teams this year, and every indication indicates when talking to last year's players that most players are coming back. Abiodun Ayorinde and Shane Kilburn for sure are returning. Abiodun mentioned "the games are played on a full-size pitch in Harvest Hills; playing eleven a side." Shane adds "the Organizers, Janice and Ali, have really setup a great recreational league."

Harvest Hills Golf Course Status Update

Calgarians for Responsible Development



What is the status of the sale of the golf course?

The golf course has been sold by Windmill Golf to Cedarglen Homes. Their intent is to remove the golf course and redevelop it as residential housing, town houses and as many 4 story condo units as they can. However the City has not yet approved rezoning the land from special recreational to residential. So it is NOT a done deal.

Is there a group trying to stop the development?

Yes. When the sale was announced we formed a committee to oppose the development. We have spent the last few months doing research to understand the process, where we can influence it and how can we stop it. It has become clear to us that this is a battle we can win if we pull together. It is also clear that the city wants to substantially increase the density of population within the current boundaries of the city. So this makes it a city wide issue and we need to deal with it as such in order to get the support to sway the vote of all councilors and to get that support we need to get a petition. That is why we chose Calgarians for Responsible Development as the name for our committee. So it is not a done deal.

What else has the committee been doing?

We have been identifying the issues we have as a community with the addition of all the new housing units and an addition of 2,000 more people such as:

- Traffic congestion (this affects all the Northern Hills communities).
- Impact on Nose Creek water shed both from a wildlife as well as a storm water management view.
- Impact on recreation with loss of golf course and additional people vying for access to programs at Cardel Place.
- Impact on local shopping, amenities like doctor's offices, schools, etc.

Hello Residents of Northern Hills

Alberta's budget has been a hot topic for 2015, and getting it right for constituents in Calgary-Northern Hills has been a top priority. Over the last five years, we have been successful at getting schools built for our community; Panorama Hills Elementary School; Captain

ola Goddard School; Nose Creek and another one will open in 2016, along with \$10 million in infrastructure. In addition, we are well along in planning and developing a multi-purpose health and community services centre in collaboration with Northern Hills Community Association, health, social, and cultural groups.

As one of Alberta's fastest growing communities, it is important that we focus on key spending priorities for our area. In February, I held several budget consultation opportunities with residents of Calgary-Northern Hills, and met with many of you door-knocking. Here is a summary of what you told me:

- Most residents prefer reducing our spending, rather than increasing taxes or user fees or running
- · Around half of our community members would support reinstating health care premiums, but without burdening low-income Albertans.
- Many residents suggested reducing municipal spending, while protecting regional and provincial priorities such as health and education.
- Residents had mixed feelings about increased fuel taxes or a provincial sales tax.
- Some residents suggested reducing pay for public

- sector employees, and the size of middle management.
- Some residents saw opportunities to grow and diversify our exports to Asia and Europe by taking advantage of a lower Canadian dollar.

I have brought your views to my colleagues and Premier Jim Prentice, and we will do our best to develop a budget that responsibly supports and sustains our community now, without burdening our future.




