Back to school safety

Alberta Health Services EMS would like to remind parents and students of some basic road safety tips as streets become busier with the return of the school year. Pedestri-

ans and motorists each have an important role to play- road safety is a shared responsibility.

Around school buses

- Flashing amber lights mean a bus is slowing down to stop. Motorists should do likewise.
- No matter which direction you are coming from, STOP when approaching a school bus with activated flashing red lights - unless the bus is on the opposite side of a divided highway from you.
- Driver courtesy goes a long way. By simply being alert and cautious when approaching a school bus, you are contributing to school bus safety.

Motorists

- Avoid talking on cell phones, texting, or any other behavior that diverts your attention away from driving.
- Give right of way to pedestrians who have activated overhead crossing lights or who are waiting to cross from a street corner.
- Remember it is illegal to pass vehicles, other than those that are parked, in school zones or playground

zones during posted hours.

Pedestrians

- Cross only at marked crosswalks or street corners that have clear visibility from all directions.
- Make eye contact with all drivers before crossing the street.
- When activating overhead crossing lights, pause before stepping off the curb to ensure motorists in both directions have come to a complete stop.
- Stay within the crosswalk lines until fully clear of the road way.
- Obey pedestrian lights at intersections. Cross the street only when you see the 'walk' sign and only when all cars have come to a complete stop.
- If you are with young children or pets, hold your child's hand firmly and keep a solid grip on leashes when crossing.
- Remember: children learn by observing you. By teaching them safe crossing habits as early as possible you can reduce the chance your child may be involved in a preventable auto/ pedestrian collision.

What's in a name? A tale of two City Parks.

ormally when naming a park in Calgary, City Council must approve the name. However, there is the curious case of Egerts Park in Thorncliffe. Egerts Park was named after John Egert, a City of Calgary Parks employee in the mid 1900s, who was instrumental in the development of some of the parks in North Calgary, including his own. Unfortunately, Egert died of cancer in the 70s, and the park was infor-

mally named after him by Park's staff, a name which took hold and is still in use today. Naming signs will be placed at the North end of the park and another one at an additional location acknowledging his contribution.

Nose Hill Park, which consumes a large portion of Ward 4, is thought to be named because its likeness to a nose when viewed from a certain angle. It officially became a park in 1980 and is the second largest park in Calgary, surpassed only in size by Fish Creek Park. It is home to a number of large mammals including coyotes and deer and is one of the most significant examples of fescue grassland ecosystems left on the Canadian prairies. Along with the Bow River Valley, it is one of the two remaining examples of the high plains that once covered this area, and is considered an endangered ecosystem. Most grasslands of this nature have been lost to cultivation, agriculture, pollution, forestation, and development. In the 1980s, a great deal of the park was intended for residential development, but citizen action saved the land for its current use as the beautiful park it is today.

Elsewhere, funding for phases one and two for the Laycock Park Wetland Restoration Project has been secured. Parks plans to hold an open house in the fall to inform the public on the project's progress.





Are Your Child's Eyes Ready for School?

Vision is an integral part of a child's learning and development and is the fourth most common cause of disability in North America. This is an important statistic as 80 per cent of what children learn come from their visual processing of the world. Vision problems can sometimes be

the root of learning difficulties. Fortunately, they are treatable, especially with early detection.

Frequently Asked Questions:

When should my child have an eye exam?

The first eye exam should be at six months old and yearly thereafter. Alberta Health Care covers children's annual eye exam until 19 years of age. Alberta's Eye See Eye Learn program

also covers a pair of spectacles for a child attending kindergarten.

How do I know if my child is having vision problems?

<u>How is vision related to</u> learning?

Vision is more than just seeing 20/20. Good vision means being able to read efficiently, clearly and comfortably for an extended period of time. Good vision is the ability to interpret visual information so we can looking shapes and letters such as b, d, p and q. Furthermore, good vision allows us to visualize information in our minds, enabling us to succeed in reading comprehension, math and abstract concepts. Many children who have difficulties in school often have a vision problem. It is important to emphasize that vision is a learned skill, similar to walking and talking. If your child is

falling behind in school, vision therapy can help acquire these fundamental visual skills.


<u>How can we treat vision</u> problems?


Glasses, visual hygiene and/ or vision therapy may be prescribed. Vision therapy is an individualized program of neuroptometric exercises performed both in-office and at home which will help remediate the aforemen-

tioned vision problems.

As parents, you play a vital role in your child's development. An annual eye examination can detect risk factors for vision problems. If additional testing and treatments are indicated, then a developmental optometrist will be able to help your child improve visual skills and excel to his/her full potential.


